

AFTER MORE EVIDENCE

AGAINST SNOWDEN

Police Believe Him To Be Guilty—Mr. and Mrs. King Questioned Again.

Marshal Carter and Deputy Marshal House, of Baltimore, are still confident that John Snowden, colored, now in a cell at the Baltimore City Jail, is the murderer of Mrs. Lottie May Brandon, who was killed in her home here on Second street on the morning of August 8. In keeping with the conviction, the two policemen are directing the energies of the members of the department who have been working on the case to the gathering of additional evidence against the man.

Headquarters Detectives Kratz-Pohler and Dougherty, all of Baltimore, are still hard at work on the case, and they are co-operating with the Anne Arundel county authorities in the task of bringing to justice the brute who choked Mrs. Brandon to death in the little home here.

Owing to the fact that it is believed that the Annapolis authorities will have trouble picking up a jury of men who have not expressed an opinion on the case or who may not be prejudiced against Snowden on account of his race, there is a possibility that a change of venue will be asked by the attorney who is appointed to represent the colored man when he is brought to trial.

Headquarters Detectives Pohler, Kratz and Dougherty again questioned Mr. and Mrs. Thomas A. King, neighbors to the Brandons', for over two hours, but failed to elicit any additional information.

Mr. and Mrs. King had been spending a week-end at Colonial Beach, but they did not come here together. Mr. King reached here early yesterday and later in the day his wife motored to this city and presented herself.
