

## Court Proceedings Continued.

The case before the court when our last issue was put to press, was No. 7 crim. appr., State vs. John Harding, indicted for taking and carrying away bedded oysters. Indictment demurred to and demurrer over ruled. Plea, Not Guilty and submitted to Court. At 8:30 p. m., the Court adjourned for the day.

Thursday, Sept. 30th, 1886. The court met—His Honor, Judge Crane on the bench. The Petit Jury was called and their attendance noted. The committee appointed by the court to examine Richard E. King, colored, an applicant for admission to the bar, reported that they had performed their duties and did not find the applicant qualified for admission. Thereupon, the court declined to admit him. The case, pending which the court, on Wednesday, adjourned, was then resumed and the court found the traverser guilty as charged and imposed a fine of \$5 and costs. D. C. Hammett, Magruder and Camalier & Abell for State; Robt. C. Combs for the defense. The case, No. 8 appeals, was then called and proceeded with as follows: Levi J. Wise vs. Sarah J. Hazell, appeal from Justice Camalier, motion for new trial and motion withdrawn. At 5 p. m., the court adjourned for the day.
