

Miss Emilie A. Doetsch, lawyer and feminist, has been indorsed for judge of the Juvenile Court by the Business and Professional Women's Council of the National Woman's Party and the Alumnae Association of the Western High School. Both groups have written Gov. Harry W. Nice asking her appointment.

It is understood that several other organizations interested in social welfare work who are backing Hamilton Hackney's candidacy for the office are supporting Miss Doetsch for the post of associate judge.

#### Served Under Broening

She is a former newspaper woman. Under Mayor William F. Broening she served as Assistant City Solicitor and is the only woman to hold such an office here.

She attended the Zion School, Western High School, Goucher College and the Baltimore Law School, later absorbed by the University of Maryland and was admitted to the bar in 1907.

She belongs to the local chapter of Phi Delta Delta, international women's legal fraternity and is a past president of the Women Lawyers' Association. Miss Doetsch is also a member of the League of Women Voters and the Quota Club, an organization of business and professional women.
