Emilie Doetsch is a lawyer and newspaperwoman. She was an ardent suffragist and is a member of the National Woman's Party and an active worker in its campaign to remove all discriminations in the law and elsewhere against women.

During the incumbency of Edith Houghton Hooker as editor of "*Equal Rights*", national organ of the National Woman's Party, Miss Doetsch served for several years as its managing editor.

She was the first woman to seek office in the Baltimore City Council and the first to be appointed a member of the Law Department of Baltimore City.

She is the daughter of the late Louis J. Doetsch, pioneer lithographer, and of Johanna Pohl Doetsch, and is a graduate of Goucher College and of the Baltimore Law School. She has four sisters, all of whom are college graduates.
