

Meeting of Colored Citizens.

A meeting of colored citizens of Morgan's Creek Neck was held on Thursday last to take action upon a letter which was sent them in response to rumors of threats made by some of their citizens against Messrs. Medders and Justis, of Kennedyville, in relation to the lynching of Taylor, at which meeting the following resolutions were adopted:

WHEREAS, We desire to manifest to the public, by word and action, that prejudice, retaliation and threats are not the dominant spirit of the intelligent and Christian colored citizens of Kent county.

Resolved, That we assure Messrs. Medders and Justis, and all others, that we are humane and in accord with whatever promotes the welfare of the people and the protection of property.

Resolved, That we carefully admonish the wayward ones of our people (the minority) and assure them that we assent to nothing that menaces our social quietness and Christian excellence.
