Ordered, That the Evening Capital and Ann
 Council Advertiser be designated as City Printer
 for one year, from November 1, 1898, at the sum
 of \$200 each.

Which was adopted.

Alderman Bates offered the following.

Resolution

(Whereas, This City has been disgraced by the recent
 happening.)

Be it resolved, That we, the City Council, of Annapolis,
 now in session, do hereby express our condemnations
 of the mob, who taking the law into their own hands
 on Wednesday night October 5th 1898, killed the negro
 Smith, confined in the County Jail, especially as
 in a short time he would have had a speedy trial
 and been punished according to law and to his
 just desert.

Counselor Moss, moved that the Resolution be
 referred to the Alderman of the Third Ward, to
 report at the next meeting of the Board.

Whereupon,

Alderman Ellinghausen, moved that the Resolu-
 tion be adopted,

Which was rejected.
