Dear Russell:

I wish to confirm discussing with you your three letters of July 15th at our meeting yesterday.

These letters contained your suggestion that the new Annapolis-Washington Boulevard be named the "John Hanson Boulevard", and that the new Boulevard paralleling the ocean be named "Ocean Highway". I reported that the Governor approved both these suggestions.

The third letter suggested a name for the spur road into Annapolis. The Governor feels that it might be desirable to consult with the Maryland Historical Society and any other such agency to determine whether there was not an appropriate figure of Colonial or Revolutionary times for whom this road might be named, of the type of, perhaps, Charles Carroll, Governor Eden, William Paca, etc.
