Death of William Bryan.

We are deeply pained to learn of
the death of one of our oldest and
most-reputable citizens, Wm. Bryan.
He died in the City of Baltimore last
night at 11 o'clock, in the 86th year
of his age. During his long residence
in this city, he filled many important
political offices, the duties of which
were always discharged with strict
fidelity and highly satisfactorily to
the people. In 1845 he was elected
mayor of the City of Annapolis; he
served several terms as sheriff of the
county; was school commissioner a
number of years; register of wills;
city tax collector; census taker in
1850; several times alderman of the
city; was also city commissioner, and
filled faithfully a number of minor
offices in the city and county. In the
private walks of life Mr. Bryan was
universally respected. He was kind-
hearted, charitable, an exemplary citi-
zen, and a true friend. His remains
will be brought here for interment in
the City Cemetery, on Monday at
two o'clock and taken from the depot
to the cemetery.
