HAMMOND, Major Nathan, died lately at his plantation on Elk Ridge in the 54th year of his age; formerly High Sheriff of A. A. Co. (May 6, 1762) Anne Hammond is executrix. (June 17, 1762)

HAMMOND, Nathan, of Annap., and Sarah Jane Tate of Washington, D.C., were married Thurs. last. by O. B. Brown. (Dec. 25, 1834)

HAMMOND, Nicholas, Esq., late President of the Farmers Branch Bank at Easton, died Thurs. evening last, 11th inst., in his 73rd year at his residence in Tal. Co. (Nov. 18, 1830)

HAMMOND, Mr. Philip, Esq., died Sat. last [May 3], at the Head of Severn, one of the Representatives for A. A. Co., and for many years past successively chosen to serve in that station. He was appointed Speaker in 11 sessions. [Long obit is given.] (May 8, 1760) Charles Hammond, Jr., is executor. (July 31, 1760). At an election to choose a Representative for A. A. Co., in the room of Philip Hammond, Esq., dec., the latter's son John Hammond was unanimously chosen to succeed his father. (Oct. 16, 1760)

HAMMOND, Mr. Philip, died Mon. last, a gentleman of a most respectable character. (May 8, 1783)

HAMMOND, Major Philip, Sr., died Sat. night last. (Nov. 28, 1822)

HAMMOND, Madam Rachel, died Sat. last [Feb. 25], worthy consort of the Hon. Col. Charles Hammond, at his plantation on the Severn. (March 1, 1749)

HAMMOND, Mrs. Rachel, relict of Philip Hammond, died Tues. morning last [April 11], in her 75th year. (April 13, 1786)

HAMMOND, Rachel Ann, third daughter of Dr. William Hammond, died Thurs., 20th inst., on the north side of Severn, aged 4 years, 11 months, and 18 days. (Nov. 27, 1834)

HAMMOND, Rezin, of Annap., son of Major Nathan Hammond, and Rebecca Hawkins of the north side of Severn, were married Thurs. evening last [Sept. 2]. (Sept. 4, 1760)

HAMMOND, Col. Rezin, departed this life at his farm in A. A. Co., on Friday, 1st inst., in his 64th year. [Long obit gives details of his service in the American Revolution, the State Convention, and the State Legislature.] At an advanced age he retired from the turmoil of the world to the peaceful quiet of his farm. (Sept. 6, 1809)
