S BARNES ASSAULTE

Negro Attempts to Kill Him on His Faim Near King's Creek.

Excitement No. 2 reached Pocomoke City Tuesday evening when it was learned that a negro named Edward Watson had assaulted Mr. Sam'l S.

Barnes at his home near King's Creek, in Somerest county and that the life Mr. Barnes was in the balance

with great chances against his recov-Shortly after the altercation Mr.

Barnes was hurried to the Peninsula General Hospital at Salisbury and for

several hours his life was dispaired of. The assault took place on the Barnes farm, about a mile from King's Creek. Somerset county. Mr. Barnes, who is one of the most prominent farmers of Somerret county, had a dispute with the negro over some farm work, when the negro struck him with a piece of scantling, dealing several blows over the head, after which he stamped upon him and kicked him in the face several times. Walson then hurriedly left the

neighborhood and a posse of white men, armed, started in pursuit of the negro, while Drs. Fisher and Lanklord hurried to Salisbury with Mr. Barnes, who was operated on by Drs. Dick and Tull for fracture of the skull.

of the assault soon spread over the

place, going toward Virginia.

The negro was caught at Pocomoke City, near the railroad station, at 8 o'clock Tuesday night and almost in an instant a large mob gathered around. The officers demanded that the ne-

gro be given up to their care and a determined effort was made by the authorities to get the prisinor off to Princess Aune on the S 30 train, but the large crowd present made the attempt unsuccessful. The negro was then rushed up town and placed in the lockup tollowed by a large cloud of interested persons. On the way from the station to the lockup the negro received sever-

al blows on the head and in the excite ment one pistol shot was fired the bul let taking effect in the negto's body. Later he was removed to Princess Anne by Deputy Sheriff Charles G. Dale and spenial efficer John S. Melvin, and handed over to the Sometset authorities, At last accounts both Mr. Barnes and his assailant were better than at first reported.
