

# C. Philip Nichols, Sr., Former Md. Delegate

Laurel, Md., Dec. 28 (Special)—A requiem mass for C. Philip Nichols, Sr., former member of the Maryland House of Delegates, will be offered at 11 A.M. Wednesday at St. Mary's Church here.

Mr. Nichols, 42, who was also a Laurel real estate executive, died of a heart attack yesterday at his home here.
