PRINCE GEORGES COUNTY CANDIDATES WITHDRAW

Aspirants for State Senator-
ship Leave Field to Sasscer;
Ager May Run.

BOWIE OPPONENT QUILTS

Withdrawals of candidates have considerably changed the complexion of the primaries in Prince Georges county, which will be held September 14.

Charles B. Ager, a member of the house of delegates, withdrew yesterday as a candidate for the Democratic nomination for State senator, leaving State Senator Lansdale G. Sasscer, seeking renomination, as the sole candidate in either party. County Commissioner John M. Bowie, of the Queene Anne district, candidate for the Republican nomination for State senator, also withdrew yesterday.

Mr. Ager announced that he will make the race as an independent candidate in the regular election in November. In order to do this he must obtain signatures of 500 citizens of the county, and file the petition with the board of election supervisors fifteen days before the election.

Charles M. Roberts, of the Kent district, withdrew yesterday as a candidate for the Democratic nomination for State's attorney, leaving the incumbent, Alan Bowie, of Brandywine, unopposed among the Democrats.
