

# Prince Georges Post Sought By McCullough

Robert W. McCullough, Washington and Maryland attorney, yesterday announced his intention to seek election as State's attorney for Prince Georges County.

McCullough, 52, filed a petition of candidacy Friday for the post held by State's Attorney A. Gwynn Bowie since 1941, subject to the Democratic primary next September. Bowie, whose current term expires December 31, has not indicated whether he will seek reelection.

A native of Cecil County, Md., McCullough was graduated in dentistry from George Washington University and practiced for about 14 years in the District before turning to law. After receiving a law degree from National University he established law offices both here and in Prince Georges County, but has devoted most of his practice to Maryland.

He has been active in civic affairs in both the District and Maryland and is past president of the Bladensburg Democratic Club, the Prince Georges County Exchange Club, the Optimist Club, the Northeast Business Men's Association and the Federation of Business Men's Associations of the District. He is a past patron of Naomi Chapter of the Eastern Star and a member of the East Gate Lodge of Mount Rainier, the Elks and the Young Men's Democratic Club of Prince Georges County.

McCullough, who lives at 4614 Addison Chapel rd., Beaver Heights, Md., is the first candidate to file for the Prince Georges County post.
