

# Two County Candidates Withdraw

Two candidates for nearby Maryland county offices have withdrawn from the primary races.

In Prince Georges County, Robert W. McCullough, Beaver Heights attorney, yesterday withdrew his candidacy for the Democratic nomination for State's attorney.

In doing so, McCullough pointed out that he had stated at the time of his filing that he would not be a candidate if State's Attorney A. Gwynn Bowie ran for reelection. Bowie filed for the office late last week.

In Montgomery County, election officials disclosed that Gerald D. Morgan, Bethesda attorney, has stepped out of the Democratic primary for a county council seat.

Morgan's filing for the primary led to court actions which resulted in voiding of the county's no-party label election law.

Successive rulings of the Montgomery County Circuit Court and the Maryland Court of Appeals upheld the State-wide Lindsay law, which requires partisan elections of county councils.

The Board of Election Supervisors refused to accept Morgan's candidacy in the Democratic primary until after the Appellate Court's ruling was handed down.
