

# NEW ELECTION SUPERVISORS APPOINTED

## Governor's "Green Bag" Shows New Names For Somerset Board

Wednesday afternoon Governor Harry W. Nice sent the long-awaited "Green Bag" containing his appointments to State civil offices to the Senate for confirmation.

Among the major appointments were:

Walter R. Rudy, of Mount Airy, nominated to be Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, succeeding the veteran Col. E. Austin Baughman, whose term has expired. If his nomination is confirmed Rudy will hold office for two years from May 6.

Edgar C. Czarra, of Hyattsville nominated for a term of four years as Land Commissioner. He would succeed Henry L. Morris, of Prince George's county, appointed by former Governor Albert O. Ritchie to fill the vacancy caused by the death of George C. Peverly.

W. David Tilgman, Jr., of Howard county received the nomination as Parole Commissioner succeeding Graylord Lee Clark.
