

## Proceedings of the City Council.

**FIRST BRANCH**—*Thursday, June 28th, 1866.*—  
Present James Young, Esq., president, and a  
quorum of members. Mr. Gorsuch, from the  
committee on the fire department, reported a  
resolution authorizing Michael Bond & Sons to  
erect a steam engine on their premises No. 8  
Swann street; which was adopted. Mr. Price,  
from the committee on the harbor, reported a  
resolution authorizing John T. Fardy & Brother  
to build a platform pier on piles at their ship-  
yard, 50 feet wide and extending 175 feet into the  
basin, foot of Montgomery street; which was  
made the special order for to-morrow evening.  
Mr. McGuire presented a communication from  
the board of school commissioners, stating that  
they have elected Rev. J. N. McJilton superin-  
tendent of public instruction, at a salary  
of \$3,000 per year, in conformity with a  
recent ordinance of the city council. Mr.  
Jones offered a resolution requesting the  
city commissioner to furnish the branch with a  
statement of the expense of fitting up Hollins  
market hall. Mr. Marsh, from the committee on  
police and jail, reported a resolution authorizing  
William H. Hedden to attach lettered curtains to  
his awning, which was adopted. Mr. Lankford,  
from the committee on commerce, reported a  
resolution appropriating \$3,000 for a resurvey of  
the harbor by the superintendent of the coast  
survey. The ordinance to prohibit the manufac-  
ture of lampblack within the city limits was  
called up and postponed. Mr. Henneberry  
offered a resolution providing for stepping  
stones across Aliceanna street, at its intersection  
with Wolf street, which was adopted. Mr.  
Herring offered a resolution directing the city  
surveyor to furnish the branch with a plat of the  
proposed extension of German street, from  
Charles to South street. The branch adjourned.

**SECOND BRANCH.**—Branch met—Present, Dan-  
iel Harvey, Esq., president, and a quorum of  
members.—A resolution to lease a lot on the  
corner of Caroline and Bank streets, and build a  
school-house thereon for primary school No. 25,  
was received from the first branch, and laid on  
the table. Mr. Ireian offered a resolution of in-  
quiry to the commissioner of health as to how  
many of the sanitary police may be dispensed  
with at the present time; adopted. An ordinance  
to authorize A. & W. Denmead to extend their  
wharves in front of their premises at Canton,  
was received from the first branch, and laid on  
the table. Adjourned.
