

R. D. BARTLETT'S RITES TOMORROW

Funeral services for Rober Dixon Bartlett, who died Saturday after a short illness, will be held at 11 A.M. tomorrow at the Stony Run Friends Meeting, 5116 North Charles street.

Mr. Bartlett, 71, died at his home, 200 Cedarcroft road.

He had been a member of the law firm of Bartlett, Poe and Claggett for 45 years. The firm was founded by his father, J. Kemp Bartlett, Sr., who died in 1948.

A native of Baltimore, he attended Princeton and was graduated from the University of Maryland Law School in 1915.

Served In World War I

During World War I he served as a Lieutenant (j.g.) on the U.S.S. Pennsylvania, a battleship on active duty in the Atlantic.

Mr. Bartlett was a member of the bar associations of Baltimore and Maryland. He served as chairman of the nominating committee of the city group.

Mr. Bartlett also served as president of the board of the Maryland School for the Blind, was a fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers, and a member of the Stony Run Friends Meeting.

He is survived by his second wife, Mrs. Catherine Thom Bartlett. His first wife, Alice Carroll Bartlett, died in 1936.

He also is survived by two sons, Robert Dixon Bartlett, Jr., and Carroll W. Bartlett, both of Waynesboro, Va., two stepsons, W. Lennox Dawbarn, of Charlottesville, Va., and H. D. Dawbarn, of Waynesboro; three brothers, Francis G. Bartlett, of Easton, and James D. Bartlett and J. Kemp Bartlett, Jr., both of Baltimore; one sister, Mrs. Robert A. Gibney, of Easton, and seven grandchildren.
