HOUSE OF DELEGATES.

In the printed proceedings received yesterday we find the report of the Committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice in relation to the case of Charles W. Hanson, one of the Associate Judges of the Sixth Judicial District. It concludes with recommending the adoption of the following resolution and address:

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, two thirds of all the members of each House concurring, that the following address be presented to his Excellency the Governor:

To his Excellency the Governor of the State of Maryland;

It appears to this General Assembly, from satisfactory evidence, that Charles W. Hanson, Esq. one of the Associate Judges of the Sixth Judicial District, has been for some time, and continues to be from the deranged state of his mind, incompetent to the discharge of his official duties, and that the public interest requires his removal.— You are therefore respectfully requested, upon the receipt of this address, to remove the said Charles W. Hanson from his office of Associate Judge of said district.

All which is respectfully submitted.

The said report was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Buskirk, Chairman of the Committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, by a special leave of the House (the rule prescribing the order for the considering of business, being further suspended for the purpose) submitted the following order for consideration, viz:

By the House of Delegates.

February 10. 1830.

Ordered, That a copy of the report of the Committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice in relation to the condition of the Judiciary in the Sixth Judicial District, together with a copy of the testimony taken by the said committee, be made out and forwarded to Charles W. Hanson, Esquire, one of the Associate Judges of said Dis-

strict—that the said Hanson be permitted to appear at the Bar of the House in his defence, in person or by counsel—and that the Clerk be directed to issue subpoenas, returnable on Monday next, for such witnesses as the said Hanson, or his counsel, may require.

The said order was read the first time; and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Nicholas reported a bill to incorporate the Baltimore Theatre and Circus.

Also an act to divorce William Kempton; and Matilda, his wife, of the city of Baltimore.

Mr. Buchanan reported a bill to divorce Martha A. Hollingsworth from her husband Parkin Hollingsworth.
