

Know all men by these presents that I Alexander Cattell of Albemarle County in the State of Virginia have made ordained constituted and appointed and by these presents do make ordain constitute and appoint William Robertson of George Town in Montgomery County State of Maryland my lawful Attorney for me and in my name for my use to ask Demand sue for recover and receive of and from all persons whatever in the State of Maryland all and any sum or sums of money debts dues claim and demand, whatever now due owing or accounting to me and I do hereby empower and authorize my said Attorney to make up settle adjust or arbitrate all accounts reckonings and differences whatever which I have with any such persons on bonds bills notes & accounts and upon receipts of any sum or sums of money or other satisfaction to give Receipts acquittances and discharge for the same or otherwise to compound and agree the same and I do hereby give unto my said Attorney the whole power of and concerning the same and will ratify and confirm whatever he may lawfully do of and concerning the premises In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty first day of November anno Domini Seventeen hundred and ninety four Alex^r Cattell

Exam'd At the request of Samuel Brooke the following Deed was recorded this 1st day of December 1794, to wit, This Indenture made this twenty eighth day of November One thousand seven hundred and ninety four between Thomas Moore and Mary his wife Richard Thomas and Deborah his wife Margaret Brooke, Caleb Bently and Sarah his wife Isaac Briggs and Hannah his wife Roger Brooke and Dorothy Brooke of the one part and Samuel Brooke of the other part whereas, Thomas Brooke late of Montgomery County deceased did by his last will and testament amongst other things devise unto the said Samuel Brooke Mary Brooke Deborah Brooke Margaret Brooke Sarah Brooke Roger Brooke and Dorothy Brooke all of Montgomery County and State of Maryland two thousand acres of land lying and being in Montgomery County and whereas by the said last will and testament he did devise the residue of his lands (Except his share of Mount Radnor and Pembroke) to James Brooke Gerard Brooke Deborah Brooke and Basil Brooke of the same County and state and whereas the said Samuel Brooke Thomas Moore and Mary his wife Richard Thomas and Deborah his wife Margaret Brooke Caleb Bently and Sarah his wife Isaac Briggs and Hannah his wife Roger Brooke and Dorothy Brooke on the one part and the said James Brooke Gerard Brooke of

B Plessants and Deborah his wife and Basil Brooke on the other part have heretofore by a deed of
 Indenture bearing date the twenty eighth day of November seventeen hundred and ninety four ap-
 pointed to each other respective lands by virtue of which allotment the said Samuel Brooke Mary
 Moore Deborah Thomas Margaret Brooke Sarah Bentley Hannah Briggs Roger Brooke and Do-
 rothy Brooke are seized of their two thousand acres of land by certain metes and bounds which said
 lands are part of addition to Brooks Grove part of the survey on Brooke Park part of Fair Hill
 and part of suburban surveys as by the said last mentioned Deed of Indenture a reference thereto
 being had will fully and at large appear and whereas the said Samuel Brooke Thomas Moore
 and Mary his wife Richard Thomas and Deborah his wife Margaret Brooke Caleb Bentley and Sarah
 his wife Isaac Briggs and Hannah his wife Roger Brooke and Dorothy Brooke have respectively
 agreed amongst themselves to make partition between them of the said two thousand acres of land
 so as aforesaid to them allotted and the same to divide in eight equal parts respect being had to
 the different parts of the land and whereas upon said partition the lands hereafter described

 have granted assigned and delivered and by these presents do grant assign and deliver unto the
 said Samuel Brooke one eighth part of said lands respect being had to value with the appur-
 tenances thereto belonging to wit all that part of Addition Brooks Grove part of the sur-
 vey on Brooke Park part of Fair Hill and part of suburban surveys contained in the following
 courses and distances and Beginning to include the whole at a stake in a heap of stones near
 a Chestnut tree with nine notches it being the end of the ninth line of tract
 of land called Hobson's choice and running with the said land north twenty five degrees
 west ninety two perches south eighty two and one half degrees west west seventy four perches
 north twenty one degrees west sixty seven perches then south sixty five degrees west twenty
 two perches to a stone marked B near two small Chestnut bushes with nine notches each
 south sixteen and three quarter degrees west one hundred and sixteen and one half perches
 to a stone marked M between a white oak and black oak with nine notches each north
 seventy six degrees west sixty four perches to a stone marked P south twenty eight degrees
 East two hundred and twenty six perches to a stone marked CB near a small Hickory sapling with
 nine notches north forty two degrees East thirty two perches to a stone marked SB near
 a small white oak and hickory with nine notches north forty two degrees East one hundred
 eighty four perches to a stone marked S near a black oak sapling with nine notches
 then north forty two degrees East ten perches to the first Beginning containing two hundred

hundred and fifty acres of Land, more or less To have and to hold the said last described lands with the appurtenances herein before mentioned to be assigned unto the said Samuel Brooke his heirs and assigns forever, severally for his proportion and in view of his eighth part of the aforesaid two thousand acres of land devised as aforesaid and the said Thomas Moore and Mary his wife Richard Thomas and Deborah his wife Margarett Brooke Caleb Bentley and Sarah his wife Isaac Briggs and Hannah his wife Roger Brooke and Dorothy Brooke do severally for themselves their Heirs Executors and Administrators Covenant and Grant to and with the said Samuel Brooke his heirs and assigns by these presents in manner following that is to say that they will at all times warrant and defend the said one eighth part unto the said Samuel Brooke his heirs and assigns from and against all persons claiming the same from under them or their heirs and that they will at all times hereafter upon the reasonable request and at the proper costs of him the said Samuel Brooke his heirs or assigns execute any further conveyance or assurance in law for the better conveying and assuring the above assigned lands unto the said Samuel Brooke his heirs or assigns forever agreeably to the true intent and meaning of these presents in witness whereof the said Thomas Moore and Mary his wife Richard Thomas and Deborah his wife Margarett Brooke Caleb Bentley and Sarah his wife Isaac Briggs and Hannah his wife Roger Brooke and Dorothy Brooke have hereunto set their hands and sealed the day and year first aforesaid Sealed and delivered
