Father and Nicholas Sartell, of Montgomery County are held and firmly bound to the State of Maryland in the sum of one thousand dollars current money to be paid to the State of said and its certain attorney to which payment well and truly to be made as said ourselves and heirs Executors and Administrators jointly and severally jointly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this thirtieth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two - The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden Richard Willard shall well and truly perform the office of Administrator with a copy of the Will annexed of Anne Mary Ann, late of Montgomery County deceased according to law and shall in all respects discharge the duties of him required by law as Administrator with a copy of the Will annexed of said without any injury or damage to any person interested in the faithful performance of the said office, then the above obligation shall be void; it is otherwise to be in full force and virtue in Law -

In the name of God Amen. I Charles B. Hutton of Montgomery County and State of Maryland being sick and weak in body but of sound disposing mind memory and understanding do make and Publish this instrument of writing as and for my last Will and testament, in manner and form following, that is to say - I request that my body be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named, and after my just debts and funeral charges are paid, and my Wife's thirds taken out of my estate, I devise and bequeath as follows - To my Son and son Charles Thomas Duley, and Enoch Duley, and their heirs I give and bequeath the sum of one hundred dollars to be equally divided between them, the same to be paid by my Executors at the expiration of twelve months from and after a final settlement of my estate without interest - To my daughter Anne Duley, and her heirs I give and bequeath Fifty dollars to be paid by my Executors at the expiration of twelve months from and after a final settlement of my estate, without interest - There I will and direct that the real and residue of my estate both real and personal of every description whatsoever, be divided in the following manner that is to say - To my son Enoch I give three fifths and the remaining two fifths I give to my daughter Elizabeth

to them and each of them, and their heirs and assigns forever - and in case either of my said children Enoch or Sarah Eliza - both should die without lawful issue - In that case I give to the Survivor; and to his or her heirs all the residue parts of my Estate as described in above devise - and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Enoch to be sole Executor of this my last Will and testament, revoking and annulling all former Wills by me made, ratifying and confirming this and none other to be my last Will and testament - In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Seventeenth day of August in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty two -
