The Court binds Jane Lewis <sup>the Daughter of Ann George</sup> an Infant of 9 years of age, as an Apprentice to John Shaw of the City of Annapolis, as a Semitreef, the said John Shaw obliging himself to cause her to be taught to read and write, and to pay her the sum of six pounds <sup>Currency</sup> at the Expiration <sup>1694</sup> of her time of servitude, in lieu of freedom dues.

The Court binds Alexander Pransburg an Infant 15 years of age the 11<sup>th</sup> day of February <sup>as an Apprentice</sup> to John Shaw of the City of Annapolis, to be brought up to the business and to be taught the Trade of Cabinet making also to cause him to be taught to read and write, and to learn to Cypher as far as the Rule of three, and also to pay him six pounds Currency at the Expiration of his time of servitude, in lieu of freedom dues.

The Court binds Robert Johnson an Infant 18 years of age this day as an apprentice to John Howard to be brought up and taught the Occupation of Shoemaking, to learn him to read and write also to Cypher as far as the Rule of three, and to pay him six pounds Currency, at the Expiration of his Apprenticeship, in lieu of Freedom dues.

M<sup>r</sup>. Cornelius Garretson produces his Account for the Rent of the Room for 10 Days until this Court, which was allowed by the Court, to the sum of Twelve pounds Currency, and ordered that the Sheriff pay the same.
