

SEVENTY DOLLARS REWARD.

Camp, 13 miles from Philadelphia, Dec. 1, 1777.

DESERTED, from the First Regiment of Maryland regular troops, commanded by Col. J. H. Stoen, the seven following soldiers, viz.

SAMUEL GLASGOW, a serjeant of the company, late Murray's, deserted from Morristown, in New-Jersey, the 24th of July last, is a stout well made fellow, born in Cecil county, Maryland, 24 or 25 years of age, 5 feet 9 or 10 inches high, short dark hair, dark complexion, somewhat freckled, and has a large scar on his left cheek. Had on and took with him, a light coloured coat, faced and lined with scarlet, with pewter buttons, marked 10, light coloured waistcoat, and buckskin breeches. He has been seen in Baltimore.

HUGH ARMSTRONG, of the company, late Murray's, deserted from New Hanover, in Jersey, on the 2d of July last, born in Ireland, about 30 years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, has long black hair, fair complexion, much addicted to liquor; and down look. Had on and took with him, a green sagathy coat and waistcoat, a pair of black knit breeches, linen shirts, and thread stockings.

GEORGE BENNETT, a corporal of Capt. Winder's company, born in Ireland, a stout well made fellow, light coloured hair, tied, and fresh complexion, 28 years of age, and 5 feet 8 inches high. Had on and took with him, a light infantry cap, with silver lace round the edge; and B. L. I. in a cypher in front, short blue coat, lined with scarlet, and pewter buttons, marked U. S. A. one red and one white waistcoat, buckskin breeches, a pair of white overalls, cotton stockings, white hunting shirt, a pair of large silver buckles, marked G. B. Said Bennett attempted to make his escape immediately as the action began at Brandywine, but was detected; and made his escape on the retreat. He has since been seen in Baltimore.

THOMAS READ, a private of Captain Winder's company, deserted on the retreat from Brandywine, is a well made fellow, born in England, 25 or 26 years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, has short dark hair, and dark complexion. Had on and took with him, a blue regimental coat, lined and faced with scarlet, and pewter buttons, marked 3. M. R. a brown cloth waistcoat, buckskin breeches, woollen stockings, a fine hat, with a set hat buckle; shoes with silver buckles, two or three good linen shirts, with the initial letters of his name marked above the wrist.

WILLIAM EVANS, a private of the company, late Murray's, deserted on the 27th ult. a stout well made fellow, 24 or 25 years of age, 6 feet 1 inch high, has short brown hair, and dark complexion. Had on and took with him, a brown cloth coat, lined with part of a tent cloth, red waistcoat, leather breeches, dark yarn stockings, half worn shoes, a cocked hat, and 2 or 3 good linen shirts.

WILLIAM WALKER, of the company, late Harwood's, a well set fellow, born in England, about 23 years of age, 5 feet 6 or 7 inches high, and has short black hair. Had on and took with him, a dark brown coat, with lappets of the same, a grey waistcoat, buckskin breeches, blue yarn stockings, a round hat, and one or two linen shirts. He went off in company with Evans.

JOHN BOOTH, of Capt. Ewing's company, a stout well made fellow, born in Ireland, about 33 years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, has short black hair, and dark complexion. Had on and took with him, a blue coat, with red facings; a white cotton jacket, light coloured thickset breeches, white yarn stockings, and a pair of new shoes, with strings. — It is supposed all the above deserters are in Maryland.
