sleep, with the Pot in his Hand, in Bed; and fometimes with his Mouth full of Meat : In this Manner he lay about ten Weeks, and then he could cat not thing at all; for his Jaws feemed to be fet, and his Teeth clinched to close, that with all the Art they aled with Infiruments, they could not open his Mouth, to put any Thing in to support him; at last observing a Hole made in his Teeth, by hold ing his Pipe in his Mouth, they now and then posted some Tent into his Mouth, through a Quill; and this was all he took for fix Weeks and four Days, and of that not above three Pints or two Days, and of that not above three Pints or two Quarts; he had made water but once, and never had a Stool all that Time. On the 7th of August, which was seventeen Weeks from the 9th of April, when he began to sleep, he awaked, put on his Cloaths and walked about the Room, not knowing he had slept above a Night; nor could he be per swaded he had laid so long, till going into the Fields, he found every Body busy in getting in their Harvess; and he remembred very well, when he fell assep, that they were sowing their Barley and Oats, which he then saw ripe, and fit to be cut down. There was one Thing observeable, that the his Flesh There was one Thing observeable, that tho' his Flesh was fomewhat wasted with lying so long in Bed, and fasting for above six Weeks; yet a certain Gentleman affured Dr. Oliver, that when he faw him, which was the first Day of his coming abroad, he look'd brisker than ever he faw him in his Life before; and upon afking him, whether the Bed had made him fore, he affured this Gentleman, that he never found that, nor any other Inconveniency at all; and that he had not the least Remembrance of any Thing that passed, or that was done to him all that while; so that he went again to his Hufbandry, as he was wont to do, and remained well for that Time, till August 17, 1697, when in the Morning, he complained of a Shivering, and a Coldness in his Back, he comited once a similar Coldness in his Back ; he vomited' once or twice, and that same Day fell into his sleeping Fit again. Dr. Oliver going to fee him, found him asleep, with a Cup of Beer and a Piece of Bread and Cheese up. on a Stool by his Bed, within his Reach; the Doctor felt his Pulfe, which at that Time was very regular; and he also found his Heart beat very regular too, and his Breathing was easy and free; the Doctor only observed, that his Pulse beat a lit-tle too strong; he was in a breathing Sweat, and had an agreeable Warmth all over his Body; then the Doctor put his Mouth to his Ear, and called him as loud as he could feveral Times by his Name, pulled him by the Shoulders, pinched his Nose, Stopped his Mouth and Nose together, as long as he could without choaking him, but to no Purpofe, for all this Time he did not give the least Sign of his being sensible: The Doctor listed up his Eyelids, and found his Eye balls drawn up under his Eye brows, and fixed without any Motion at all; then the Doctor held under one Nostril for a confiderable Time, a Phial with Spirits of Sal Armoniac, extracted from Quick Lime; then he injected it feveral Times up that same Nosiril; and, though he had poured into it about half an Ounce of this fiery Spirit, it only made his Nose run, and his Eye-lids shiver and tremble very little. The Doctor, finding no Success with this crammed, that Noffril with Powder of white Hellebore, and flay ing some Time afterwards in the Room, to see what Effects all these together might have upon him; he never gave any Sign that he felt what the Doctor had done, nor discovered any Manner of Uneafines, by stirring any one Patt of his Body, that the Doctor could observe; and after all these Experiments, the Doctor left him, being pretty well fatisfied that he was really affect, and no fullen Counterfeit, as fome People supposed. Upon the Doctor's relating what he had observed, several Gentlemen from Bath went out to see him, and found him to be the condition the Doctor had left him. him in the same Condition the Doctor had left him in the Day before, only his Nose was a little inflamed and swelled very much, his Lips and Infide of his right Nostril were bliftered and scabby, occasion d by the Spirit and the Hellebore. About Mr. Woofmer an Apothecary, finding his Pulse pretty high, drew about 14 Ounces of Blood from his Arm, tied it again and left him as he found hims and Mr. Woolmer affured the Doctor, that er made the least Motion in the World when he pricked him, not all the while his Arm was bleeding. Several other Experiments were made by fuch as went to fee him from Bath, but all to no The Dodor law him again the latter End of September, and found him just in the same Posture, lying in his Bed; but now his Pulse was not so strong, nor had he shy Sweats, as when the Doctor saw him before; he tried him again, by shopping his Nose and Mouth; but to no Purpole; and a Gentleman ran a Pin' line his Arm; to the very Bone, but he gave no Signs of his being sens. ble of what was done to him. In all this Time,

the Doctor was affured that no Body had feel him the Doctor was affired that no Body had feel him eat or drink, though they endeavoured it as much as possible, but that it always stood by him; and they observed, that sometimes once a Day, at other Times once in two Days all was gone It was further observable, that he never souled his Bed, but always went to the Pot. In this Manner he lay till the roth of November, when his Mother hearing him make a Noise, ran immediately up to him and sound him eating: the asked him. How he him and found him eating; the asked him, How he did? Very well, he faid, thank God; the asked him again, Which he liked bell, Bread and Butter, or Butter and Cheefe; he answered, Bread and Cheefe; upon this the Woman; overjoyed left him to acquaint his Brother with it; and both coming overland the Brother with its analysis of the Brother with its a ming up into the Chamber to discourse with him, they found him as fast asseep again as ever, and they could not by any Means awake him. From this Time to the End of January, or Beginning of this Time to the End of January, or Beginning of February, he did not sleep so profoundly as before; for when they called him by his Name, he seem'd to hear them, and became somewhat sensible, tho he could not make them any Answer. His Byes were not shut so close, and he had frequently great Tremblings of his Eye lids, upon which they expected every Day when he would awake, which did not happen till about the Time mentioned; and then he awaked perfectly well, remembring and then he awaked perfectly well, remembring nothing that happened all the while. It was observed, that he was very little altered in his Flesh is only he complained, that the Cold pinched him only he complained, that the Gold pinened him more than usual, and so he presently went to Huibandry, as at other Times.
