W H E R E A S, a great many
false Reports have been raised, by Deserters
from the Virginia Regiment, that they were dis-
charged from said Regiment, had Leave to be ab-
sent for a Time, or that the Regiment was entirely
broke: By which feign'd Stories, they have been
allowed to pass free and unmolested. This is,
therefore, to give Notice, that all Soldiers who
are found two Miles distant from the Camp or
Quarters, without a Furlough or Discharge sign'd
by me, or the Commanding Officer for the Time
being, may be deem'd and taken for Deserters.
And for Encouragement of taking up and securing
such, a Reward of One Pistole shall be given for
any Deserter so taken and brought to the Quarters,
if within ten Miles of the Place; and Two Pistoles,
if taken at a greater Distance:

under his right Eye, (speaks broad; being born in
Northamptonshire or *Oxfordshire* in England, and
says he was bred to Farming: He went off in an
Osnabrigs Shirt and Trowsers, Country Shoes iron'd
round the Heels, and a Steel Collar round his
Neck; but may have got it off, and stole better
Cloaths.

—On the 23d of August, *George Dale*, aged about
