**LONDON** News. This Day both Houses of Parliament, when the Session is finished, and the Lord Keeper Command, made the following.

My Lords, and GENTLEMEN, In Pursuance of the Authority of his Majesty's Commission Seal, amongst other Things Causes of his holding the Majesty has been graciously to assure you, that he always is and will be able to promote the Events, that may promote the Peace of his Kingdoms.

That, in Consequence of the Assistance which he has given him, his Majesty has exerted to carry on the War in the most effectual manner, and in order to that desirable End, a safe and honourable Peace, Divine Providence to bless his Arms and Success in every make our Enemies feel, that the Britain is not to be provoked with We have it also in Command to acquaint you, that the Conquest of *Louisburg*, with the *Bretton* and *St. Johns*; the taking of the highest Importance to our *America*; and the Reduction of *St. Louis* to bring great Distress upon the Colonies; and, in Pursuance of the great Advantages to our own Trade, which have been made sensible, that we are sent forth to invade and possess of their Neighbours, their Inaccessibility to his Majesty's Forces they have experienced in their Works at *Chesterburg*, erected in a particular View to the defence of the *Loys* of a great number of Vessels; but no Treatment, his Majesty, would tempt him to the innocent Subjects of that Kingdom.

In *Germany*, his Majesty's good Success, and *Prince Ferdinand's* found full Employment for the Army and her Confederates; from which both by Sea, and in *America*, have evident Advantage. Their Success, God, to their able Conduct, his Majesty's Troops; and this has been signal and glorious.

His Majesty has further to serve to you, that the common sense and Independence is still making great Efforts, against the attempts to oppress it. That the Commerce of the Source of our Riches, has been restored from his Majesty's Troubles. In this State of Affairs, his Majesty, thinks it unnecessary to persuade you to bear Arms; effectually to stand by his Majesty; vigorously to support it, and the rest of his Majesty's Affairs yourselves to reduce our Enemies to a more reasonable Terms of Accommodation.
