That they shall accordingly the Governor-General of Islands, or in his Absence Governor of each Island, divide the Islands of Tobago convenient Districts or Parishes and the other Islands most convenient Situations proper for Fortifications, Navy, and other military

That the said Commissioners a proper Situation in every convenient for Trade and Navigation to consist of Lots of different Houses, to which Gardens, not exceeding six Acres Lot: And that in laying they shall reserve convenient Quays, and for all other and reserve in every Parish all seem necessary for the pair of Fortifications and prevent that Drought which the usual Consequence of Woods.

That they shall also trace great Roads in each Island for the Convenience of Communication and Town, and set out the Limits of Plantation Land of the Purchasers thereof.

That uncleared Lands of Parish for such poor Settlers Governor-General of the Islands, or the Lieutenant-Governor where such Lands lie, for the native Caribbees continue undisturbed in Cottages and Grounds.

That with Respect to the Islands of St. Vincent and the Grenadines, which have been occupied by Treason of the Faith of Treaty Crowns of Great-Britain and preface Contradiction to the Court of France; and as given to any of the Governors thereof, the Commissioners any Establishment of the of the Settlements made by His Majesty has never pleased to encourage the pretence to continue under his patent, on certain Terms, Reservations; and the Commissioners execute his Majesty's Instructions as follows:
