

24 That for every Hundred Acres of cleared Land, the Purchaser is or shall be possessed of, he shall keep thereon one white Man, or two white Women, under a Penalty of Forty Pounds Sterling for every white Man, and Twenty Pounds Sterling for every white Woman that shall be wanting; and pay an annual Quit Rent of Six-pence Sterling per Acre, on whatever cleared Land he has purchased, or shall clear in Pursuance of the Conditions required.

That a Reservation shall be made to the King of all Gold or Silver Mines which are now, or may hereafter be discovered in the said Islands.
