Five Pounds Reward.

Straps through, and an old Snaffle Bridle.

He had on, and with him, the following Cloaths, viz. a  
blue napped Cotton Fes Jacket, with Cuffs to the Sleeves,  
and black Gimp Buttons on it, and open Pockets without  
Flaps. An old red Jacket without Sleeves, an old New-  
market blue Cloth Coat, a Pair of old greasy Leather Bree-  
ches, which seemed to be too small for him, and a Pair of  
brown Sagathy Breeches, a Pair of very coarse Shoes (made
