

Part, is at least ridiculous and absurd: That the Reputation of the Person who is not only Part Owner of the Vessel, on this Side of the Water, stands so clear from Suspicion of any undue Practice, in his Commercial Concerns, that the Profecutor has not even attempted to insinuate the least Circumstance to his Disadvantage. That innocent Owners, therefore, may not be trepan'd, by an Indulgence, almost universally extended by the Officers of the Customs, to all other Cases, and only withdrawn in this, for some private and inexplicable Reason; I do therefore, upon the general Equity of the Claimant's Case, and for the Reasons above-mentioned, order, adjudge, sentence, and decree RESTITUTION of the said Ship Ann, her Tackle, Furniture, and Apparel, and the non-enumerated Goods on board, to the said Claimant, on behalf of the Owners; and that the Marshal of this Court be served with an Order to re-deliver the same accordingly. And I do adjudge, that each Party pay his own Costs of the Suit: And be the Claimant, hence dismissed, without Delay.

It seems hardly probable that the Disturbances in our Back-Settlements will entirely subside, notwithstanding all the prudent Steps that have, or can be taken by the Government to suppress them, until the late Act of the General Assembly of the Province, for establishing Circuit-Courts take Place; for we daily hear of new Irregularities committed by the People called Regulators, who, seeming to despair of rooting out those Gangs of desperate Villains that remain among them, any other way, still take upon themselves to punish such Offenders as they can catch.—We hear, that within this Month, one Watts, and one Distoe, have received 509 Lashes each, by their Direction; and that an infamous Woman has also received corporal Punishment.—We hear also, that one John Bowels has lost his Life in attempting to kill Mr. Woodward, one of the Leaders of the People called Regulators. According to our Account, Woodward refused to surrender himself, Bowels fired at, and would have killed him, but the Ball struck the Barrel of a Gun which he held across his Breast, upon which some People, in Company with Woodward, fired, and killed Bowels on the Spot.

July 19. While Captain Higgins lay in the Downs, for a fair Wind, Three Frigates from Portsmouth, full manned, passed by for the River Thames, and the Yachts there, were completely armed. The Dolphin Man of War was just arrived from her Voyage round the World, and the new discovered Island, supposed the Land of Giants; she had been out Two Years and Four Months, and had on board a Number of uncommon Beasts and Birds.—Just before Captain Higgins left the Downs, he was informed from Deal, that John Wilkes, Esq; had taken his Seat in the House of Commons, in Consequence of his being duly elected for the County of Middlesex.

BOSTON, July 18.

However supine, indolent, or contented, the Enemies of the Country may have been represented, the Inhabitants in general, to see the apparent Uneasiness, Distress and Vexation, so visible in the Countenances, and Conduct of the People, of all Ranks, among us, would lead one to form a quite contrary Estimate of their Condition. The more wealthy and sensible, looking upon themselves deeply affected, by Acts rendering them more abject than the lowest of their menial Servants, whose Complaints can ever freely reach their Master's Ear, and seldom fail of exciting Compassion and obtaining Redress. The Populace, conceiving themselves deserted, and exposed naked, to the Ravage of increasing Swarms of merciless Taskmasters, despairing of Relief from any other Quarter, endeavour by main Force to break the Snare, and escape, as a Bird from the Hands of a Fowler.

This turbulent and distracted Condition of the People, calls loud for the Interposition of some Gentlemen of steady Principles, and real Patriotism, to advise and consult the best Measures for their Preservation, in this dark and gloomy Season, when it seems, as if the legal Mouths of the whole British America were to be totally and finally stopped. Neglected, the Consequences may be such, as the most secure, will wish he had endeavoured to prevent, when he finds he can neither remedy, nor avoid them.

This Province not having been favoured with a Station-Ship during the last War, were at a prodigious Expence to build and maintain Ships, to protect their own Coast.—We now behold Five, parading in our Harbour; and, what is very diverting, hovering round Cattle-William, as if there were the greatest Danger of its being attacked, at a Time of profound Peace.

July 25. We hear from Salem, that a Meeting of the Inhabitants of that Town was held there on Monday last, when, it is said, they passed Votes of the following Import.—1st, That the Town of Salem approves of the Proceedings of the late House of Representatives, in not rescinding.—And, 2d, That the Thanks of the Town be given the Gentlemen of the late House, for their Firmness in defending the Liberties of the People.

A Vessel arrived at Salem, last Saturday, from Fal-mouth, which she left the 20th of May, the Master of whom informs, that the Mobs in London were greatly increased; and had done a great deal of Mischief.—The Packet-Boat, with the Mail for May, failed the Day before this Vessel, for New-York.

We hear that his Majesty's Ship the Launceston, of 40 Guns, is shortly expected here from Halifax.

PROVIDENCE, July 23.

The Hon. Thomas Cushing, Esq; Speaker of the late House of Representatives of the Massachusetts-Bay, has received Letters from several of the Members, who were necessarily absent when a late important Matter was agitated, expressing their deep Concern in not having had an Opportunity to join with their respectable Brethren, in firmly adhering to the Resolution which they were commanded to rescind; but declaring that they perfectly agreed in Sentiment with the Ninety-two, and should have thought themselves highly honoured in bearing a public Testimony against the Requisition.

NEW-YORK, August 1.

Wednesday Night died at his House in this City, of a lingering Illness (which had for some Time rendered him incapable of Business) Mr. WILLIAM WEYMAN, for many Years past, a Printer of Note in this City.

ANNAPOLIS, August 11.

Several Houses having been lately broke open within this City, and Effects stolen from the Inhabitants, to a considerable Amount; as also a most atrocious Attempt to set Fire to a House, the Property of Mr. Nathaniel Adams. The Corporation have passed a Law, obliging the Inhabitants to keep Watch every Night, to prevent further Mischief.
