From the POLITICAL REGISTER Account of the Proceedings at the King's Bench, pursuant to an Advertisement, by the several Plaintiffs, Traders, and principal Merchants, to meet there on Wednesday next, to consider of an Address to be presented to the King.

WEDNESDAY

A Meeting of the Gentlemen Traders of the City of London, at the Cornhill, only by Letter, dressed to the King, but by the King's when Edward the Sixth took the Chair. A Variety of Opinions were expressed, and much Confusion prevailed among the Traders, but nothing was concluded but to adjourn till next Wednesday, and then to consider of what should be done.

On this Occasion the following Speech was made by the Chairman, by a Gentleman returned as from as he had concluded.

SIR,

FROM the Pains which some of us have received, I expected to see more numerous Assembly in this House of a large Number of Gentlemen, but what it carries with it is not sufficient to give it the appearance of Authority. I fear it will be a demonstration of Respect and little that declared Intention is more than I do, in being able to resist the best of Princes for his Government; and, indeed, Condition would this Countenance of the Nation, but to the People could not distinguish themselves, then, our Address would be insignificant. But if, as we suspect, it be meant to pay a great Ministry, we should prefer of their Conduct deserves it. not turn out to their Advantage, we take upon us to contradict the Sense of the Nation, but to the sense of universal Contempt. Is there a Man among us, who would be so far from integrity in the present Administration, as to let him stand forth; let us know him—let him be made a Scorn and Derision of his Countrymen. As to these Foreign Gentlemen for the Laws and Constitution, and believe they have more modest in them to leave the Natives of the Country to be presumed to understand it very decent for Strangers of Assistance, before they can particular Sentiments, their laying them at the feet of the King, in their own world do Justice to their Dutch, they must unite the Dutch with the natural Englishman.
