AN ACT.

To extend to all the citizens of Maryland the same Civil Rights and Religious Privileges that are enjoyed under the constitution of the United States. Whereas by the declaration of rights of this state, it is declared that it is the duty of every man to worship God in such manner as he thinks most acceptable to him: And whereas, by the constitution of the United States, which is the supreme law of the land, it is declared that no religious test shall ever be required as a qualification to any office or public trust under the United States: And whereas, certain citizens of Maryland are deprived of civil rights and rendered incapable of holding office on account of their religious principles; therefore,

AN ACT.

To repeal all such parts of the Constitution and Form of Government as relate to the division of Anne-Arundel county into five separate election districts, and for other purposes. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all such parts of the constitution and form of government, which relate to the division of Anne-Arundel county into five election districts, except as to the first, second and third districts, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

AN ACT.

To alter and change such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the oaths to be taken by the members of the senate and house of delegates, and all other officers therein mentioned. Sect 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That every member of the senate and house of delegates, before he shall act as such, shall take and subscribe the following oath or affirmation, to wit: I, A. B. do swear (or affirm, as the case may be), that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to the state of Maryland, and that I will support the constitution and laws thereof; that I will not directly or indirectly receive the profits, or any part of the profits of any office during the time of my acting as senator (or member of the house of delegates,) and that I will faithfully discharge my duty as senator (or member of the house of delegates,) without prejudice or partiality, to the best of my skill and judgment. And that electors of the senate, and all executive and judicial officers, before they act as such, and all persons elected or appointed to any office of profit or trust, civil or military, before entering upon the duties thereof, shall respectively take and subscribe the following oath or affirmation, to wit: I, A. B. do swear (or affirm, as the case may be), that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to the state of Maryland, and that I will support the constitution and laws thereof, and that I will to the best of my skill and judgment, diligently and faithfully, without partiality or prejudice execute the office of _____ according to the constitution and laws of this state.

AN ACT.

To alter and change such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the oaths to be taken by the members of the senate and house of delegates, and all other officers therein mentioned. Sect 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the sheriff of Anne-Arundel county, shall give notice of the place of holding the election in each election district so laid off anew, by causing the same to be inserted in one of the newspapers of the city of Annapolis, once a week, for at least two months previous to holding the election in October, eighteen hundred and twenty-four.
