EXECUTION OF ANOTHER OF THE BURKITES.

The following account of the execution of... Elizabeth Ross, or Cook, one of the wretches... recently convicted of committing murders for... the purpose of selling the bodies as subjects... to the surgeons, is from the Traveller of the... 9th of January.

"At an early hour this morning, all the... venues leading to the usual place of execution... in the Old Bailey, and every place which... could command a view of the scaffold, were... thronged with persons anxious to obtain a... sight of the execution of Elizabeth Ross or... Cook. The prisoner, both before and after... her trial, asserted her innocence of the crime... imputed to her. On Sunday she wished to... see her son and husband, as she called him;... but this request could not be complied with... She slept tolerably well last night, and awoke... this morning about 5 o'clock; she was soon... afterwards visited by the clergyman, and again... protested her innocence. She said she was... very glad that her real name was not... known, as her husband was alive in Ireland... About 7 o'clock this morning the sheriff... arrived at the prison, and immediately proceed... ed with the governor to the prisoner. She... submitted herself to be pinioned, and while... this office was being performed, she exclaimed... "Oh! Lord, what a shame to murder an... innocent woman in this manner. I declare... before God and man that I am innocent. Oh... why did I come to this country to be butcher... ed. Oh, Mr. Wontner, I thought you were... more of a gentleman than to hang a poor... innocent woman. Why did you not send me... out of the country, or shut me up in a cell... for life. They have persecuted my poor... boy to forswear himself, and give false evidence... against me."

The Rev. Dr. Cotton requested her to think... of her soul, and pray for forgiveness. She... said she had committed many crimes, but that... she was innocent of this. The Sheriff then... gave the officers the order to proceed, and... when the culprit left the room, she called... out, "Am I to be taken into the street?" She... mounted the scaffold with a firm step, and... the moment she became visible to the crowd... a deafening yell and shout burst from it. Im... mediately she was turned off a cheer was... given. She was a large raw boned, coarse... featured Irish woman, and had been many years... remarkable for her bad habits and violent... position. She had been about fifteen years... connected with Edward Cook, her paramour... a native of Kent. The fruit of their con... nexion is the son upon whose evidence his... mother was convicted.

She always had the use of a cellar in the... house she lodged in, and frequently took... home with her poor fruit-women, Irish la... bourers, and destitute persons. It is believ... ed that Cook will be soon discharged from... custody, for no other testimony is expected... and that which has already been given, and... that has altogether failed of proving him... an accessory after the fact. The most... possible inquiries have been made into the... motive of the prisoners for committing... the murder, and the only one that could be... guessed at is the profit of the sale of the... body. Upon this subject, Bishop, the... snatcher, was very earnestly questioned... his execution, and his answer was... "You may depend upon it, it was not to sell... the body; for, at the time of the murder... (August) none of the schools were open, and... a private teacher for a pupil, and at any rate... more than a pound could not be got for one... It is well known, however, that a... pedant made by such a murder is easier got than by... labour.

Water... street is navigable for boats of almost any... tonnage. The Robert Fulton, which left yester... day for Louisville, was obliged to back yester... day to clear the "Uglio Sam." The office... of the Commercial Advertiser, at the... corner of Water and Front, is flooded with... water about four feet on the first floor. Our... publishing office at the corner of Columbia... and Main, is surrounded with water; but we... hope to reach it this morning by small craft.

The destruction of property is immense... cellars filled with water—board-yards swept... of every stick of timber—and some houses... already on the move.

Since writing the above we have been out... reconnoitring the premises. What a scene!... The water still on the rise—people mowing in... every direction—some from the first, the... second stories—others from the second... escaping in boats. It is undoubtedly, the great... est rise ever known. A friend, who arrived... in the Napoleon from above, reports nineteen... houses on the way, which may be expected... in due season.—At Lawrenceburg, below us... the houses were cleared by good cables to the... nearest bluffs—this, however, we should not... be willing to vouch for, as many entertain... serious doubts whether any vestiges can be left... by this time. There is scarcely ground... enough to be seen at Marietta for the dove... to rest upon. No one can say when the waters... will subside.

The above was written for the American... which we hoped to publish this morning; but... it is impracticable. Our printing office can... only be reached by boats. The composition... room being in a separate building, (intending... soon to move) renders it impossible to issue... the paper for the present. There is as yet... no abatement of the waters. The rivers con... tinue to rise above, swelling the Ohio to a... fearful height. Steamboats can neither load... nor unload—every one is employed in mov... ing. Mill Creek Bridge is decidedly on one... side of the question, and the whole bottom... above presents a sea of waters.

The Uncle Sam, Atlantic, Farmer, Tennes... sean, Carrollton, boats of the first class... with a great number of others are in the river... we cannot say at the landing. The '76 has... just arrived from New Orleans.

THE FLOOD.

The dam and its embankments opposite... this borough, stood perfectly firm until the... water rose higher than the embankments. A... bout eleven o'clock in the night of the 9th... this was discovered to be the case. In a few... hours the whole of the embankment was swept... away—the Lock slightly injured.

The damage done to the canal above this... place we understand is not very great, but... below it has been serious.

Between this and the Tunnel several... breaches were made in the canal and one of... the abutments of the tunnel dam was slightly... injured. Messrs. Sterett & Trux, contractors... for arching the Tunnel, lost all their tools... and the timber they had collected for the tow... path.

One half of the lock at Dam No. 2, was... thrown down, and the upper lock at Dam No... 3, was swept off.

The lock and embankment of the Leech... burgh Dam have been swept away—the Dam... is uninjured.

These are the principal injuries done to... the public works as far as we have heard. Accounts... of private losses are coming in every hour.

The saw mill at this place, was carried off... bodily.

The frame of the canal boat, which was on... the stocks, owned by Mr. Geo. Singly, boat... ed several miles down the river.

Immense losses have been sustained by the... proprietors of nearly all the salt works on... both rivers. Messrs. Boggs, Hill, Talmage, Bigham, Keeler, Brenncam & Co. and... Clousen, are the principle sufferers on the... Kiskiminetas. The loss of the first named... gentleman alone is estimated at from 40 to 50,000... dollars. On the Conemaugh, Messrs. Rogers & M-Cowen, who are the heaviest... losers, William M-Farland, Arts and Dobbin... Henry and Jacob Drum, Barker and John Royer.

Thousands of barrels of salt have been... destroyed, and many of the salt establish... ments completely demolished. Houses, stables... salt pans, fixtures and tools were swept... off by the resistless torrent.

With painful feelings we record also the... loss of one human life. A man in the em... ploy of Messrs Drum, was endeavouring to... get the horses out of the stable which was... surrounded with water. He was drowned, and... two of the horses.

Such a scene has never before occurred in... our neighborhood, and that produced by the... rise of the Ohio river and Big Beaver creek... on Friday and Saturday last. The water at... the junction of those streams was seven or... eight feet higher than ever was known before... Bridgewater, Sharn and Wallston were all in... undated, as well as the buildings up and... down the river. In some of the houses the... water was up in the second story, and most... of them near the ceiling in the first.—A... great many light buildings were carried a... way, together with hay and grain stacks and... fences. The loss in the range where the wa... ter flowed is incalculable.

Among the sufferers in this vicinity, Steph... en Stone, Esq. is the greatest. He estimates... his loss at near ten thousand dollars.—His... old dwelling house and stable were carried a... way, and a large new brick-house, lately fin... ished, and which cost about \$1000, is so much... injured that it is believed it will fall—a brick... kitchen attached to it was torn away. Messrs.

of Africa and A. J. Watson, suffered consid... erable loss; the dwelling house of the latter... being swept off. The water was up to the ceiling in Gen... Liscock's house, and his stable and other out... houses, barns and hay stacks, were all carried... away, and his valuable Library destroyed... At Sharon, the Foundry of Messrs. Da... rrah and Stow was torn away, and at Wall... ton, the Scyth Factory of Mr. D. S. Stone... was destroyed, and Messrs. Pugh, Wilson... &c., have sustained considerable loss. The... islands above, and below, have been stripped... of every thing, their occupants barely escap... ing with their lives.

The public works on Beaver creek have... sustained little or no injury.

Notwithstanding the uncommon rapid rise... of the water, and the distress produced by it... it is with gratitude we have the pleasure of... stating that there were no lives lost.

THURSDAY MORNING, Feb. 16th.

The river "still continues on the rise."—... It is undoubtedly 64 feet above low water... mark. Yesterday it rose at the rate of an... inch an hour. From six o'clock last evening... to six this morning, we should think that... the A-mulet from above reports we may expect from... 12 to 16 inches more. It was falling above... the Great Kenhawa, and was at a stand be... low. It rose several inches while the boat... was at Mayville. We should hope the a... bove may not be correct, for the scene alre... dy presented is distressing; but we under... stand a foot is the last estimate. This morn... ing it continues to rise at the rate of an inch... per hour.

We took a boat in company with a number... of others yesterday afternoon, and rowed to... the lower part of the city. The scene pre... sented cannot easily be described. It was... painful to witness destruction on so vast a... scale. Some houses upset—others in immin... ent danger. The water reached the roofs... of the more humble, and the windows of the... second stories of good frame houses. Flat... boats loaded with women and children, tur... nentine and live stock. Race, Vine, Elm and... Walnut busy with the moveables. The pa... per mills appeared to be in the middle of the... river, if river it can be called. Skiffs were... passing in every direction. We returned via... Front-street. The fine houses flooded, and... the second stories occupied of those nearer... Main—boat loads of furniture from Water... street, formed a melancholy *tout ensemble*.

Two of the workmen at Tiff's foundry were... drowned last night. They ran down the cel... lar at the time the embankment gave way to... save perhaps some effects—the water rushed... in with such fury as to render escape impos... sible. There is a report of two or three chil... dren being secured from a floating log cabin... but we cannot trace it to any authentic... source.

FRIDAY MORNING, Feb. 17th.

The work of desolation still continues.—... the river having reached nearly to Lower... Market-street. Our "composing room" is a... bout a square from the publishing office.—... When we issued the first circular, no one... presumed it would reach much further than... Columbus—but all calculations have failed:—"it is still on the rise, it is still on the rise,"... is all that is said or known. The boatmen... are crying beneath our windows, "twelve and... a half cents to the mouth of San street."—... Every kind of craft is put in requisition, tubs... boxes, canoes, flats, dog-outs, skiffs, yaws, &c. &c. The scene is as lively as the... regatta of Venice, though we may not boast... of a Bravo or Antonio. We ought to except... a baker who manages his trough with won... derful dexterity.

We cannot enumerate half of the sad ca... lamities rumour is bringing in. The river, as... it sweeps past with its accumulated waters... carries with it the wreck of its desolation. A... church passed the city with its steeple... with hay stacks, rails, leaving the farms strip... of every vestige of cultivation. The lower... Mill Creek bridge started yesterday morning... Hamilton and Colerian bridges have also... floated off, and the bridge over White River... in Kentucky. The Kentucky River had... backed as far as Frankfort, 64 miles above its... mouth. The Cumberland and the Tennes... see were both very high.

We should think the water at this time... (Friday Evening) nearly at its height—rising... this morning about one half of an inch an... hour.—We have but little to add to the a... bove. From the "look out" at the Com... mercial Hotel, corner of Broadway and Front... we had an excellent prospect of Cincinnati... as it is. The water of waters! The... suburbs East and West, with the lower part... of the city, as far as Low Market, the cel... lars of which are filled with water, were na... vigable in every direction. Newport oppo... site this city, was pretty well float—the wa... ter reaching nearly to the windows in the... second story of the U. S. Arsenal. Covington... does better—some dry land, being yet dis... cernible.

The bridges at Dayton and Miamiesburgh... are seriously injured. The embankments at

the former place appeared well—no inunda... tion. There are reports of a dreadful flood... at New Orleans—probably without founda... tion. The only lives lost, besides those al... ready mentioned, are two negroes in the East... ern suburbs.
