

MANY CANDIDATES FOR COUNTY OFFICES

Politicians in Montgomery Vicinity Looking To- ward November.

Hyattsville, Md., May 24.—Lorenzo D. Addis, of Clinton district, has announced his candidacy on the democratic ticket for the office of register of wills. The incumbent, George P. Hickey, also a Democrat, is out for reelection.

Clarence M. Roberts is the latest to announce himself a candidate for the democratic nomination for State's attorney. Lansdale G. Sasscer, of Upper Marlboro, made known some time ago his intention of seeking the nomination, and it is understood that J. F. Lillard, of Hyattsville district, also will be in the field. Alan Bowie, of Brandywine district, is another possible candidate for the democratic nomination, it is understood. John W. Ryon, jr., of Bowie district, has announced himself a candidate for the office on the Republican ticket.

For the county shrievalty Hervey G. Machen, of Hyattsville district, some time ago announced his intention of seeking the Democratic nomination for this office. Robert L. Wells, of Marlboro district will seek the same nomination, as will also Ossie Klinger, of Riverdale district.

Mr. Pyles, of the lower section of the county, will be a candidate for the Republican nomination, it is understood.

In the fight for county treasurer former Sheriff R. Fulton Gates, of Chillum district, and Herman E. Burgess, of Hyattsville district, have announced themselves candidates on the Republican ticket.

For county treasurer Henry L. Morris, of Upper Marlboro, is understood to be a candidate for the Democratic nomination for this office, and it is understood that Mayor George P. McCeney, of Laurel, might also enter the race. L. L. Gray, of Hyattsville district, has announced his candidacy on the Democratic ticket for one of the two nominations for county commissioner.

For the Republican nomination John M. Bowie, of Queen Anne district, and George N. Wells, of Chillum district, have announced themselves as aspirants. J. Jackson Suit, of Kent district, and George A. Gude, of Chillum district, both Democrats, are to retire as commissioners.
