5 VOTES MAY CAUSE PRINCE GEORGES TIE

Tally Sheets Filed With Supervisors Would Affect Small and Mulliken.

A variance of five votes in tally sheets filed yesterday with the board of election supervisors of Prince Georges county, sitting in Upper Marlboro, by election officials of the Seat Pleasant district, may result in a tie between Frank Small, jr., Republican candidate for the house of delegates, and his Democratic opponent, Kent Roberts Mulliken.

The situation is said to be unprecedented in the county. tally sheet credits Small with 139 votes, while another gives him 144. Should the smaller vote will Small Mulliken tie with 5,275 total of ballots. In that event the State legislature must decide the tie, in the opinion of Clarence M. Roberts, attorney for the board. The Seat Pleasant election officials have been ordered to appear before the board of supervisors tomorrow to explain the discrepancy.

Final returns yesterday showed that Alan Bowie, Democratic candidate for State's attorney, had been defeated by J. Frank Parron, his Republican opponent, by five votes, rather than winner by 38 votes, as first unofficial figures indicated. The final ballot gave Parron 5,475 and Bowie 5,470. Bowie's campaign against the wet and gambling interests is said to have caused his defeat.
