August 13, 1892 – first edition of the Afro-American

August 20, 1892 – copies of the oldest existing original editions

January 1, 1900 – Afro American merged with The Ledger; published under the title Afro-American Ledger

1915 – Afro-American Ledger title dropped; published under the title Afro-American

1931 – Afro-American Philadelphia Edition started for local news in Philadelphia

1934 – Afro-American Washington Edition started for local news in Washington, DC

1938 – *Richmond Planet* purchased by the board of directors; *Afro* distributed in Richmond, VA

1950 – 11 editions distributed in Baltimore, Richmond, Newark, New York, New England, and other locales

Afro-American founded in 1892 by John H. Murphy after merging two church publications: *The Ledger* (owned by George Bragg of Baltimore's St. James Episcopal Episcopal Church) and *The Afro-American* (published by Reverend William Alexander of Sharon Baptist Church, Baltimore)

During the tenure Editor-In-Chief Carl Murphy, who served for 45 years, the *Afro* would at one point circulate 13 editions across the country
