Post \$800 Collateral
All 24 persons were released
on Sunday pending a hearing under
collateral totaling \$800, which was
put up by the Wallace group and
other interested citizens.

There were 13 colered players in the group. Four of the men players were singled out as leaders and also charged with disorderly conduct when they refused to leave the courts upon orders of city and park police, and had to be lifted bodily into the patrol wagons and sauad cars.
