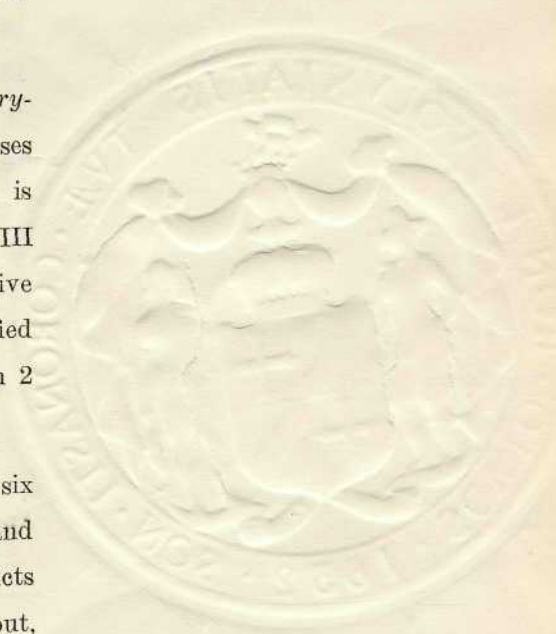
CHAPTER _____

A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT to propose an amendment to Section 2 of Article III, of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, title "Legislative Department", increasing the number of legislative districts of Baltimore City, and providing for the submission of said amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for adoption or rejection:

1 SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Mary-*
2 *land*, three-fifths of all the members of each of the two Houses
3 concurring, that the following Section be and the same is
4 hereby proposed as an amendment to Section 2 of Article III
5 of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, title "Legislative
6 Department", the same if adopted by the legally qualified
7 voters of the State, as herein provided, to become Section 2
8 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Maryland.

1 2. The City of Baltimore shall be divided into six
2 legislative districts as near as may be of equal population and
3 of contiguous territory, and each of said legislative districts
4 of Baltimore City, as they may from time to time be laid out,
5 in accordance with the provisions hereof, and each county in
6 the State, shall be entitled to one Senator, who shall be elected
7 by the qualified voters of the said legislative districts of
8 Baltimore City and of the counties of the State, respectively,
9 and shall serve for four years from the date of his election,
