A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT to amend the Constitution of Maryland by adding a new section to Article 4.

- 1 Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Mary-
- 2 land. Three-fifths of all the members of both Houses concurring,
- 3 That the following section be and the same is hereby proposed
