CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT to amend the Constitution of Maryland by adding a new section to Article 4.

1 SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Mary-*  
2 *land.* Three-fifths of all the members of both Houses concurring,  
3 That the following section be and the same is hereby proposed  
4 as an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Mary-  
5 land, and if adopted by the legal and qualified voters thereof,  
6 as hereinafter provided, the same shall stand as an additional  
7 section to Article 4 of said Constitution, to follow section 31,  
8 and to be known as Section 31-A.

9 31.A. In addition to the authority granted to the Mayor  
10 and City Council of Baltimore by the preceeding section to  
11 pay to each of the judges of the Supreme Bench the annual sum  
12 of Five Hundred Dollars, authority is hereby given to said  
13 Mayor and City Council to pay to each of said judges such fur-  
14 ther annual sum as an addition to their respective salaries as  
15 the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall from time to  
16 time deem right and proper, provided, that any such sum be-  
17 ing once granted shall not be diminished during the continu-  
18 ance of said Judges in office.

1 SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* by the authority aforesaid,  
2 That the said foregoing section hereby proposed as an amend-  
3 ment to the Constitution shall be, at the next general election  
4 for members of the General Assembly to be held in this State,  
5 submitted to the legal and qualified voters thereof, for their

6 adoption or rejection, in pursuance of the directions contained  
 7 in Article 14 of the Constitution of this State; and at the said  
 8 general election the vote on said proposed amendment to the  
 9 Constitution shall be by ballot and upon each ballot there shall  
 10 be written or printed the words "For the Constitutional Amend-  
 11 ment," and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," so that  
 12 the voter may elect; and immediately after said election due  
 13 return shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and  
 14 against said proposed amendment, as directed by the said 14th  
 15 Article of the Constitution.

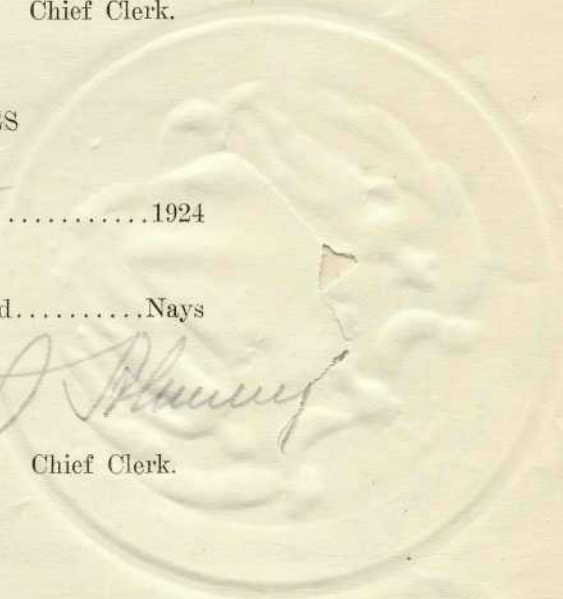

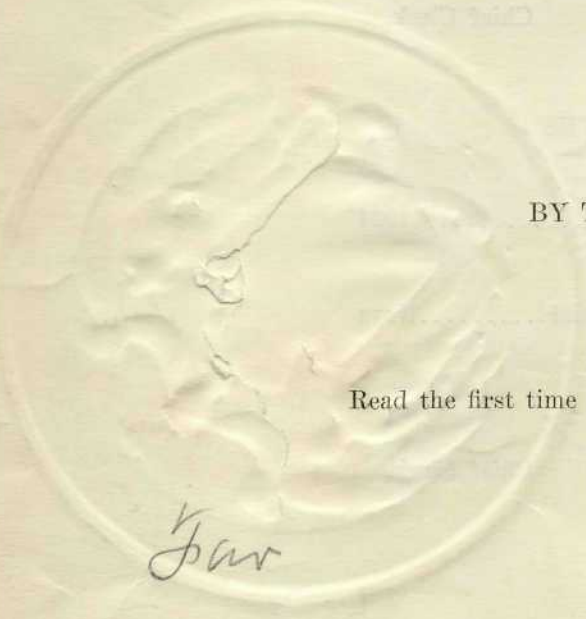
