## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT to propose an amendment to Section 15 of Article III, of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, title "Legislative Department," regulating the compensation of the members of both Houses of the General Assembly of Maryland, and to provide for the submission of said amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for adoption or rejection.

- 1 Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of
- 2 Maryland, (three-fifths of all the members of each of
- 3 the two Houses concurring), That the following be and
- 4 the same is hereby proposed as an amendment to Sec-
- 5 tion 15 of Article III, of the Constitution of the State of
- 6 Maryland, title "Legislative Department," the same if
- 7 adopted by the legally qualified voters of the State, as
- 8 herein provided, to become Section 15 of Article III, of
- 9 the Constitution of the State of Maryland.
- 10 15. The General Assembly may continue its session so
- 11 long as in its judgment the public interest may require
- 12 for a period not longer than ninety days; and each mem-
- 13 ber thereof shall receive a compensation of three hundred
- 14 dollars per annum and five dollars per diem for every
- 15 day he shall attend the session, but not for such
- 16 days as he may be absent, unless absent on account of

- 17 sickness or by leave of the House of which he is a mem-
- 18 ber and he shall also receive such mileage as may be
- 19 allowed by law, not exceeding twenty cents per mile;
- 20 and the presiding officer of each House shall receive an
- 21 additional compensation of five dollars per diem. When

- 11 shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be
- 12 printed the words "For the Constitutional Amend-
- 13 ment," and "Against the Constitutional Amendment,"
- 14 as now provided by law, and immediately after said
- 15 election due returns shall be made to the Governor of
- 16 the vote for and against said proposed amendment, as
- 17 directed by said Fourteen Article of the Constitution,
- 18 and further proceedings had in accordance with said
- 19 Article Fourteen.
