CHAPTER NO.......

A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT to propose an amendment to Section 15 of Article 3 of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, title "Legislative Department," regulating the period that the General Assembly may continue its session and the compensation of the members thereof, and to provide for the submission of said amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for adoption or rejection.

- 1 Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of
- 2 Maryland, (three-fifths of all the members of each of the two
- 3 Houses concurring), That the following be and the same is
- 4 hereby proposed as an amendment to Section 15 of Article 3
- 5 of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, title "Legislative
- 6 Department," the same, if adopted by the legally qualified
- 7 voters of the State, as herein provided, to become Section 15
- 8 of Article 3 of the Constitution of the State of Maryland.
- 15. The General Assembly may continue its session so long
- 2 as in its judgment the public interest may require, for a
- 3 period not longer than ninety days; and each member there-
- 4 of shall receive a compensation of ten dollars per diem for
- 5 every day he shall attend the session, but not for such days as
- 6 he may be absent, unless absent on account of sickness or by
- 7 leave of the House of which he is a member; and he shall also
- 8 receive such mileage as may be allowed by law, not exceeding
- 9 twenty cents per mile; and the presiding officer of each House

- 10 shall receive an additional compensation of five dollars per
- 11 day. When the General Assembly shall be convened by procla-
- 12 mation of the Governor, the session shall not continue longer
- 13 than thirty days, and in such ease the compensation shall be
- 14 the same as herein prescribed.
- 1 SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That said aforegoing
- 2 section hereby proposed as an amendment to the Constitution
- 3 of the State of Maryland shall, at the next general election for
- 4 members of the General Assembly of Maryland, be submitted
- 5 to the legal and qualified voters of the State, for their adop-
- 6 tion or rejection, in pursuance of the directions contained in
- 7 Article 14 of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, and
- 8 at the said general election the vote on the said proposed amend-
- 9 ment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each bal-
- 10 lot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional
- 11 Amendment," and "Against the Constitutional Amendment,"
- 12 as now provided by law, and immediately after said election
- 13 due returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and
- 14 against the said proposed amendment, as directed by said
- 15 Fourteenth Article of the Constitution, and further proceed-
- 16 ings had in accordance with said Article Fourteen.
