A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT to propose an amendment to repeal Section 36 of Article 3 of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, title "Legislative Department," said section prohibiting the General Assembly from authorizing a lottery, and providing for the submission of said amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for adoption or rejection.

1 SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of*
2 *Maryland* (three-fifths of all the members of each of the
3 two Houses concurring), That Section 36 of Article 3 of
4 the Constitution of the State of Maryland, title "Legislative
5 Department," prohibiting the General Assembly from
6 authorizing lottery grants be and it is hereby repealed if
7 adopted by the legally qualified voters of the State, as
8 herein provided.

1 SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That the foregoing
2 amendment to the Constitution of the State of Maryland
3 shall, at the next ensuing general election for members of
4 the General Assembly of Maryland, be submitted to the
5 legal and qualified voters of the State for their adoption
6 or rejection, in pursuance of the directions contained in
7 Article 14 of the Constitution of the State of Maryland,
8 and at the said general election the vote on the said pro-

9 posed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot,
10 and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words:
11 "For Constitutional Amendment" and "Against Constitu-
12 tional Amendment," as now provided by law, and imme-
13 diately after said election due returns shall be made to
14 the Governor of the vote for and against proposed amend-
15 ment, as directed by said Fourteenth Article of the
16 Constitution, and further proceedings had in accordance
17 with said Article 14.
