### MSASP Active in New Miller Building

Billy Bruggeman, Modular Supervisor, leads the MSASP team installing the new modular furniture in the new Thomas V. Mike Miller Jr. Senate Building in Annapolis.

"If you haven't been to see the new building, make sure you get to—it's beautiful," says Billy, describing the skylight and 44,000-tile mosaic of the State of Maryland seal.

Billy is being assisted on this job by Thomas "Jerry" Cord, his right hand person in

modular construction. For its part, MSASP will be constructing the modular units for the Senate staff which convenes every year when legislature is in session.

Billy and Jerry will be constructing a total of 61 workspaces, which consist of walls with a shelf, flip door, and task light (mounted underneath the shelf); plus a keyboard tray, pencil drawer, and lateral 2-drawer filing cabinet. To finish the job, electrical supply lines will be placed in

the wall panels. Each workspace will be color-coordinated to match the carpeting already in place.

Basic size for the units is 5'x 5' for a single worker and 10' x 5' for a double.

There will also be two 8' x 12' spaces to accommodate people with extra equipment needs. The workspaces will be used by secretaries, aides, and assistants to the Senators.

Installation began the first week in March and is scheduled to finish March 16<sup>th</sup>.
