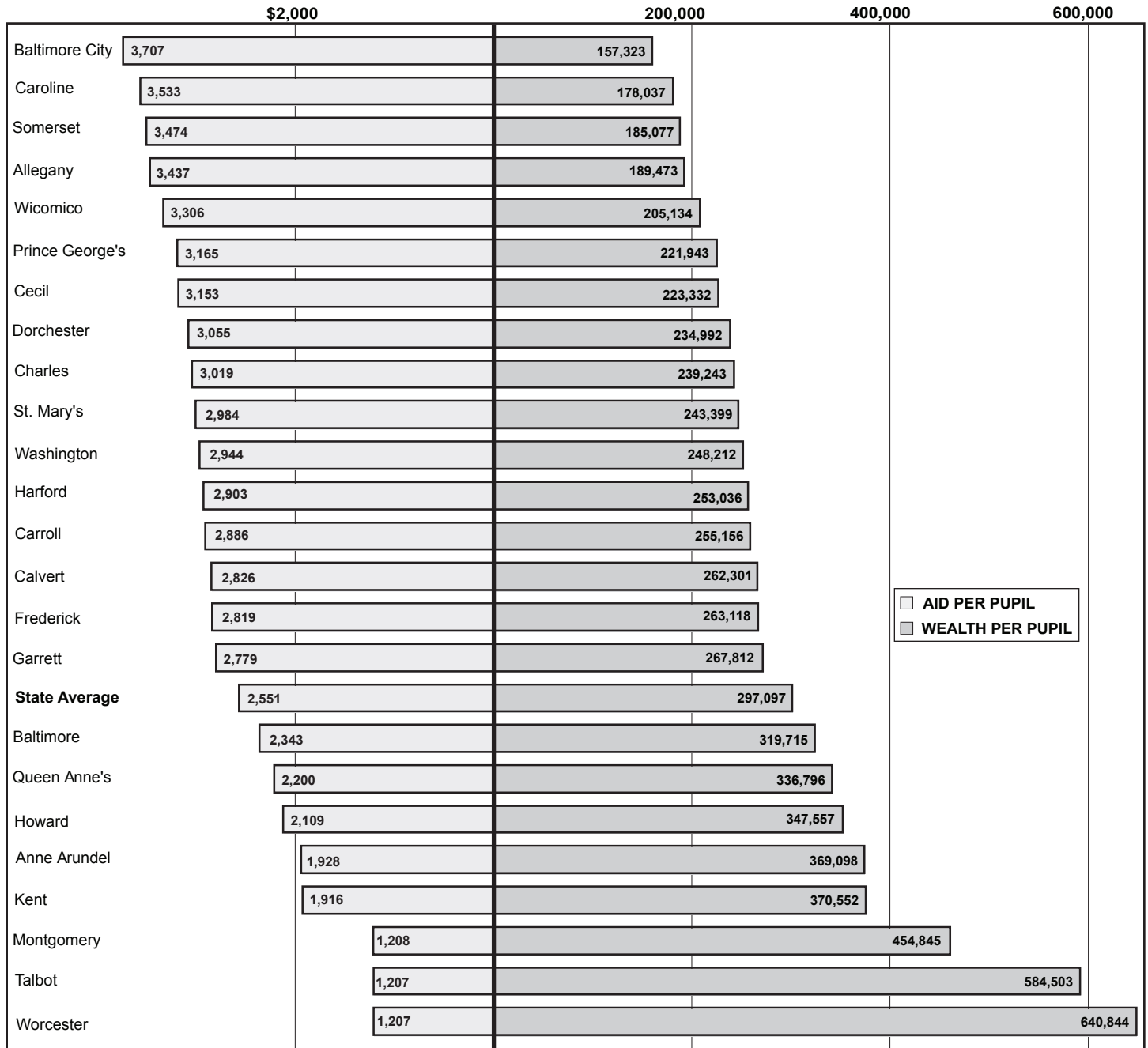
# Cost per Pupil Belonging\* Maryland Public Schools: FY 2004

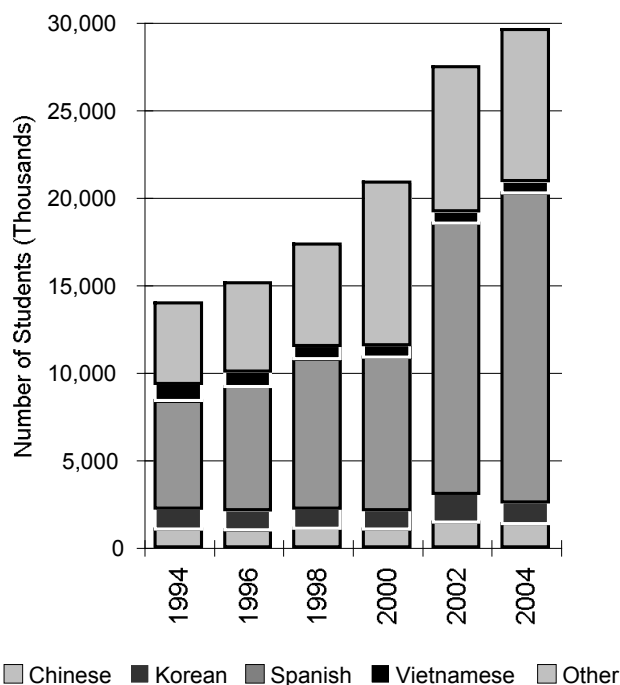

## Education Superlatives

- Maryland continues to earn "A's" for the fifth straight year for its K-12 standards and its system of student testing and school accountability, *Education Week*.
- Maryland ranks second in the nation in the percentage of high school students scoring at the mastery levels in Advanced Placement courses (scores of three to five on the five-point scale).
- The 2005 SAT results rank Maryland #1 in the Middle States Region for the third straight year.
- Maryland earns an "A-" in preparing students for college. Maryland out-performed nearly every other state in the country in preparing students for and enrolling them in higher education. The state earned an "A-" in preparation, noting performance on national math and writing assessments, Advanced Placement (AP) exams and scores, and teacher quality.
- Reading and math scores improved statewide on the 2005 Maryland School Assessment. Grade 3 reading rose from 71 percent of students at proficient in 2004 to 75.8 percent in 2005. Grade 8 math rose from 46 percent at proficient in 2004 to 51.7 percent in 2005.

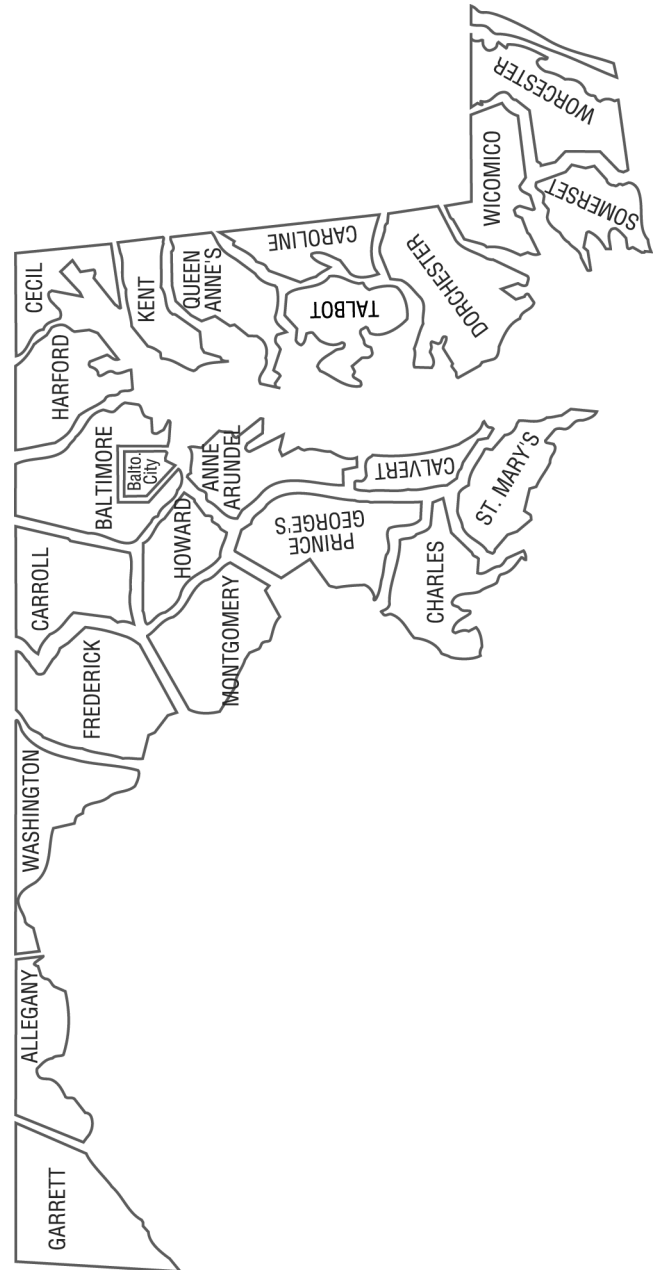
