Walther Liquors Sells Winning Mega Millions Ticket

Recent Lottery Winners Page 6 Baltimore County-based Lottery retailer Walther Liquors recently took center stage after selling one of the four winning *Mega Millions* tickets for the August 31 drawing. The winning ticket was sold to Ellwood "Bunky" Bartlett of Dundalk.

The winning ticket was for the game's \$330 million jackpot – the second largest jackpot in the game's history. As a result of selling the winning ticket, which was a quick pick, store owners Christina and John Ebmeier received a \$25,000 bonus. "It's always exciting when one of our retailers sells a winning ticket for such a huge jackpot," said Lottery Director Buddy Roogow. "Along with the winner, the store gets to bask in the spotlight, which ultimately leads to increased

foot traffic to their location." Located in the Walther Shopping Center in Nottingham, Walther Liquors has been a Lottery retailer since October 1998. The three other winning tickets for the \$330 million jackpot were sold in New Jersey, Virginia and Texas.

Set for Life Scratch-Off Features Chance to Win \$1,000 a Week for 20 Years

Don't forget to remind players to purchase their *Set for Life* scratch-off tickets. The new \$5 ticket, which debuted exclusively at the Maryland State Fair before launching statewide on September 10, features a variety of instant prizes and a top prize of \$1,000 a week for 20 years.

Aside from the three instant top prizes, the ticket also includes a collectible component. Players who collect the letters L-I-F-E can mail the letters in to the Lottery to enter a Top Prize Drawing for a fourth top prize.

The ticket is similar to the Win for Life scratch-off, which launched in 1993, and the Cash for Life scratch-off, which launched in 1997. Win for Life offered a top prize of \$1,000 a month for life while Cash for Life paid a top prize

of \$1,000 a week for life. Set for Life sold over \$1 million worth of tickets in its first week of sales, the largest oneweek sales ever for a Maryland Lottery \$5 scratch-off ticket.

Maryland Lottery Partners wi State's Horseracing Industry for Maryland Million Event

The Maryland Lottery participated in the Maryland Million event on October 13 at the Laurel Park Racetrack. Players brought non-winning *Maryland Million* tickets to the event for free admission and entered them into a second-chance drawing for \$10,000, \$5,000 and \$2,500. The winners of the second-chance drawing were George Miller who won \$10,000; Juan Gutierrez who won \$5,000; and Sylvia Johnson who won \$2,500.

"We know from past experience that when we partner with the State's horseracing industry, it's a win-win for everyone," said Lottery Director Buddy Roogow. "This type of ticket sells very well with our retailers and it increases awareness of both the Lottery and horseracing in Maryland."

Thank you to all our retailers who continue to push ticket sales of the \$25 Million Frenzy scratch-off. Although the second-chance contest has ended, there are still many instant prizes on the ticket -- including a \$1 million top prize!

We wrapped up the contest at the Maryland State Fair with José Mejia of Silver Spring walking away with the \$2 million top prize.

The grand-prize event, which was attended by a crowd of Lottery players, friends and family members of the contestants, consisted of four rounds of play. One finalist was eliminated during each of the first three rounds, leaving two people vying for the \$2 million top prize. Susan Turner of Taneytown won \$2,500; Bob Lanasa of Chester won \$5,000; and Avtar Singh of Baltimore won \$10,000. Bill Gehring of Baltimore walked away with the runner-up prize of \$20,000.

Mejia chose the cash option, giving him nearly \$1.2 million before taxes. He plans to use his winnings to take a vacation and to help family and friends.

Remind players that the odds of winning the game are better than any other online jackpot game.

By allowing players to match by line or combine for a multi-line match, the game Dorothy Weinstein of Clinton bought three *Multi-Match* tickets and won \$600,000 on one of them. She purchased her winning ticket from the Friendly Food Store in Stevensville.

provides more ways to win. The overall odds of winning anything are one in eight.

The chances of purchasing a jackpot winning ticket are just over one in 2 million, more than 87 times better than the multi-state *Mega Millions* game. Since *Multi-Match* debuted in February 2006, there have been 15 jackpot wins for a total of \$17 million in jackpot prizes. The jackpot has grown to more than \$1 million eight times.



Yet, even with all of these wins, Multi-Match has had abnormally high unclaimed prizes when compared to other Maryland Lottery games.

Tell your players to check their tickets and show them how to play and win. They might have a winning ticket and not even know it.

Procedure for Selling Your Business or **Obtaining a Lottery License**

If you are a licensed Lottery agent and you intend on selling your business, or you plan to purchase a business that is a current Lottery retail location, please consider the following:

- A Lottery license is non-transferable and becomes void upon the sale of a business by the owner.
- Any change of ownership of a business must be immediately reported to the Lottery.
- New owners who would like to become Lottery agents must apply for an agent license.
- A new owner's application must meet all requirements to become a licensed Lottery agent.
- The Lottery's approving or denying of the new owner's application will be provided in writing and shall state the reasons for the decision.
- If a licensed agent fails to report a change of ownership to the Lottery and allows the new owner to operate the Lottery without a Lottery license, the licensed owner will be held financially responsible for all amounts to the Lottery.
