

HOUSE RESOLUTION No. 272

A House Resolution concerning

Reverend Louis Foxwell

FOR the purpose of expressing the condolences of the House of Delegates with respect to the unfortunate and untimely death of Reverend Louis Foxwell.

Reverend Louis Foxwell, Director of Communications Services at the Maryland School for the Deaf, and father of the minister of the Urbana Methodist Circuit, Reverend Louis Foxwell, Jr., met his death near his Northwood home in Baltimore.

Reverend Foxwell was a totally unselfish individual who had dedicated his life to helping deaf people. His death has put the deaf community into a state of sorrow. He was an invaluable asset to the deaf people of this State; he was their minister, interpreter, counsellor, and an advocate for the rights of the deaf.

Reverend Foxwell had established a unique rapport with the students of the Maryland School for the Deaf and the entire deaf community of the State. This relationship was summarized by Dr. David Denton, Superintendent of the Maryland School for the Deaf: "There was a credibility about the Dan that the students appreciated; you could readily sense that his notives were unselfish and that his ultimate concern was for the deaf persons he served." Dr. Denton's statement accurately reflects the feelings of everyone who knew Reverend Foxwell, and by indicating his concern for people generally, and the deaf in particular, is a fitting epitaph to Reverend Foxwell. He would have liked being remembered as a man who served and cared for others. He was that kind of man; now, therefore, be it

Construction Program-Frederick Campus . . .

Within approximately one (1) year, the major program of construction which has spanned the last several years will be nearing completion. The last few years have literally witnessed the rebuilding of our School. This is an achievement in which all of us enjoy a deep sense of pride and gratitude.

The new Gymnasium is rapidly becoming a center of campus activity. Final touches are now being put to the new Gymnasium and it will be fully operational for the coming school year.

The last major facility to be constructed on the Frederick Campus is the Vocational Building which is scheduled for completion in September. Architecturally, this building is a twin sister to the Gymnasium and the two of them standing side by side bring an air of beauty and dignity to that neighborhood. Obviously, the new Vocational Building will practically double the size of our Vocational Education Program.

The whole area adjacent to the new Gymnasium and Vocational Building is scheduled for development. Site development on this part of the campus will include a wide attractive mall across the front of the two buildings, connecting them and providing access to the athletic area between and behind the two buildings. Site work there will also include the construction of surfaced playing courts for tennis, badminton, etc., planting of appropriate shrubs, the grading and seeding of playing fields, as well as, appropriate lighting and fencing. We are hoping that funds will be sufficient to allow for the construction of bleachers adjacent to the track and football field.

Projects to be completed on the interior of the main campus include, first of all, the razing and removing of the old Gymnasium-Vocational Building. This work is expected to be accomplished during the summer of 1974. After the removal of the old Gymnasium-Vocational Building, the center of the main campus will be redeveloped to include areas for pedestrian traffic, park-like areas for students, staff, social interaction and enjoyment, the planting of appropriate trees and shrubbery and the construction of a waterfountain between the Ely Building and the School Library. When site work has been completed, it will be possible to stand at the Administration Building and look across a park-like Campus into the courtyard of the old Hessian Barracks.

The Ancient Barracks is scheduled for renovation within the very near future. There is, at this time, an active contract for the restoration of the exterior of this Revolutionary Period structure and an architectural plan for the restoration of the interior is under development.



Construction-Columbia Campus . . .

The second major facility on the Columbia Campus of the Maryland School for the Deaf, the Unit for Multi-Handicapped deaf children, is scheduled for completion and occupancy in September 1974. This building will house a separate self-contained program for a maximum of 50 multi-handicapped deaf children ranging in age from four through ten. Architecturally, this building is similiar to the Phase I Elementary School, featuring expanses of glass, non-direct lighting system, natural wood decking and laminated wood beams.

The Elementary School at Columbia has earned two awards to date. The first of these was a joint citation given by the American Institute of Architects and the American Association of School Administrators for excellence of design. This citation was presented at the National Conference of School Administrators, Atlantic City, New Jersey during the Fall meetings. The second award was made by the Illuminating Engineering This citation was given in Society. recognition of the excellence of the lighting system in the school. viously, we are proud of this kind of recognition.
