## Master of Distance Education Wins International Accreditation

Dr. Stella Porto and Dr. Bernath (Oldenburg University) were on a mission. For more than a year, they and their colleagues navigated a rigorous review and audit process to win CEL accreditation for UMUC's Master of Distance Education (MDE) program, the first U.S. program to earn the prestigious designation. CEL accreditation is granted by the European Foundation for Management Development (EFMD) and represents the highest international standard for technology-enhanced learning programs in the field of management education.



"It's quite an important credential," said Dr. Porto, chair of the Information and Technology Systems Department and director of the MDE program. "It validates our commitment to quality assurance and technical enhancement."

The MDE program, offered in partnership with Oldenburg University in Germany, has been honored with two other prestigious awards—the UCEA award for Program of Excellence within the Distance Education Community of Practice and the Sloan-C award for Most Outstanding Online Teaching and Learning Program. When **Matthew Shuman** heard about UMUC's Master of Education program and its unique partnership with local schools, he realized it was the ideal way to earn his master's degree. In spring 2006, UMUC established the partnership with Montgomery County public schools in Maryland, offering the Master of Education to teachers in a special cohort format that brought them together in small groups throughout the course of study, from their first class to graduation. The format appealed to Shuman.

"I heard about the program from a colleague and decided it would be great to work on my degree alongside her and a group of other teachers who have similar needs and demands in their careers," said Shuman. He was also drawn to the convenience of UMUC's online classes. "Since all the program courses are online, I have the flexibility to complete my master's degree while also juggling everything else in my life."

Shuman, an instrumental and general music teacher at Stedwick Elementary and Whetstone Elementary schools, is especially interested in the program's specialization in instructional technology, which focuses on ways to use the Internet, software applications, and other forms of multimedia as learning resources in the classroom. Shuman plans to use the degree to pursue a career in instructional technology application in the Montgomery County school system. In the meantime, he's already putting the skills he has learned to work.

"The Web-based design class has been particularly interesting and very innovative," says Shuman. "All the courses provide skills I can apply to my job right now while also preparing me for the future. Being able to use what I'm learning has really motivated me to work hard and complete my degree."

Notwithstanding any other provision of this or any other university publication, the university reserves the right to make changes in tuition, fees, and other charges at any time such changes are deemed necessary by the university and the USM Board of Regents.

### **Tuition and Fees**

### Due at Time of Registration

All tuition and fees are due at the time of registration, unless you are enrolled in UMUC's interest-free monthly payment plan (see p. 7 for information) or you are receiving financial aid or employer-provided tuition assistance. If you register by

If payment for registration via MyUMUC or IRIS is not received by the due date, your registration may be canceled (unless you are receiving financial aid or employer-provided tuition assistance or have enrolled in the monthly payment plan). *Note.* Not paying for a course does not relieve you of your financial obligation to the university.

### Mandatory Technology Fee

A technology fee per unit of credit must be paid at the time of registration. The fee is capped at \$120 per year (which runs summer/fall/spring). See Additional Fees for details.

Payment may be made by cash (at Adelphi only), check, money order, MasterCard, or Visa. Checks should be payable to University of Maryland University College. Credit card payments are subject to credit approval immediately after registration. Note: The Board of Regents has authorized the university to charge a student's delinquent account for all collection costs incurred by the university. The normal collection fee is 17 percent plus attorney and court costs. The service charge for a dishonored check is \$25. Requests for services (for example, transcripts, diplomas, withdrawals) will be denied until all debts are paid.

All graduate students are required to pay graduate tuition for all graduate courses in which they are enrolled.

### **Refund Policy**

The official date used to determine a refund is either the date of the transaction, the date the withdrawal form is filed at the Information Desk at the Student and Faculty Services Center, or the postmarked date on a written request. The official date for federal financial aid recipients is the last date of class attendance as determined by federal regulations. Additional information is available online at www.umuc.edu/financialaid.

Financial aid awards may be canceled or reduced for financial aid recipients who withdraw from classes. Financial aid recipients should check with a financial aid advisor when withdrawing from a course to determine the impact on their awards.

*Note:* No refunds are given for technology fees or tuition for noncredit courses after the official start date of class.

### Refund for Course Cancellations

The university refunds 100 percent of tuition and technology and registration fees for courses canceled by the university. The application fee is nonrefundable, even when a course is canceled.

### Refund for Student Withdrawals

### Tuition is refunded as follows:

100%	Withdrawal before the class start date
75%	Withdrawal 1–13 calendar days after a class starts
50%	Withdrawal 14–20 calendar days after a class starts
0%	Withdrawal 21 or more calendar days after a class starts

Note: This policy applies only to students not receiving federal financial aid.

### Federal Return of Funds Policy



### REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

### **Army Students**

You may register by fax or mail if

- You have already been admitted to UMUC as a graduate student.
- You are a new student who meets the UMUC admission criteria and has submitted an Application for Admission (available at <a href="https://my.umuc.edu">https://my.umuc.edu</a>) with the \$50 application fee.
- All of your financial aid awards are enclosed or have already been confirmed.

You may not register by fax or mail if you are a financial aid applicant without an award letter or a GSL disclosure statement—unless your own payment accompanies the registration form.

### Instructions

- **1.** Complete the registration form, using black ink and printing legibly.
- **2.** Compute the amount due for tuition and fees. (Refer to p. 6 of this schedule or see *www.umuc.edu/tuition*.)
- **3.** Be sure to meet the deadlines listed under Important Dates on p. 2 in this schedule.
- 4. Either fax your registration to 301-985-7364 or mail it to the Registrar's Office—Registration, University of Maryland University College, 3501 University Boulevard East, Adelphi, MD 20783-8075 USA. Fax registrations require that you already be admitted and that you pay by credit card.

UMUC will mail you a statement of your account.
