**Procell** was founded in 2000 to develop and commercialize discoveries made for the pre- and post-exposure treatments for nerve agent exposure and the treatment, diagnosis and control of global infectious diseases of which HIV is the initial target.

**TransMedix** procures homogeneous mRNA and protein expression profiles for cells of particular disease to research, diagnostic and pharmaceutical communities worldwide.

#### Tenant News:

• Rexahn, a bio-pharmaceutical company developing an anti-cancer drug, recently signed a technology licensing agreement with Rexgene Biotech in Korea, providing Rexahn with an infusion of \$1.5 million. Rexahn, a tenant of MTDC since July 2001 has four drug candidates and plans to start clinical trial later this year on one of the candidates. Its founder, Dr. Change Ang, is also working on other promising licensing agreements that have the potential of generating more than \$15 million.

#### Graduate News:

• InteliTrac, an innovative data management product company, graduated from the incubator into an 8,000 square foot office space in Rockville, Md. Since moving into the incubator in April 2002 with two employees, the company has developed an integrated software and hardware project that provides high-speed data query and high-speed computing across multiple platforms. The product has applications in homeland security, disaster recovery and data management markets. Founded by Jonathan Vu, his company graduates with 22 employees.



• **GeneDX**'s founders, Sherri Bale and John Compton were named "Entrepreneur of the Year" from the Technology Council of Maryland. GeneDX is a full service genetic testing and diagnosis company in Gaithersburg and graduated from MTDC in 2002.

This month, the Angels and Eggs Organizing Committee officially kicked-off its 2003 program, which is scheduled to be held on October 23, 2003 at the Johns Hopkins University, Applied Physics Laboratory (JHU/APL) Kossiakov Center. The program, which is held by the Howard County Economic Development Authority, brings together the best Maryland incubator companies and the most influential Angel and early-stage investors. It also provides incubator companies with investor education, presentation readiness training, coaching, networking and access to the top, regional investors.

Thirty-two Incubator companies applied and 16 finalists were selected for the initial program, held last year. The companies presented to more then 100 attendees from the investment and business community. A major change to this year's program provides a direct link with the Maryland Incubator Companies of the Year Awards program in that all winners will automatically be Angels and Eggs finalists.

## MBIA Incubator Recognizes and Assists Student Entrepreneurs at Glenelg Country School

The MBIA announced that a group of student entrepreneurs from the Glenelg County School completed a two-year program and received a grant through the Howard County Economic Development Authority's NeoTech Incubator. NeoTech assisted the 10 high school students as part of its TechEntré program, which was created to encourage technology entrepreneurship at the high school level. Additionally through the program, the students succeeded in securing a \$3,000 investment that will be used to market their product and apply for patent protection.

The students have developed a prototype of the Lecture Library system, which allows every note written in class by a teacher to be saved and accessed by students on the Internet. Instead of writing on a chalkboard, the teachers write on a small digital tablet, which is projected onto the chalkboard or wall. The notes, exactly as written, are then catalogued, allowing students to focus on class discussions instead of scrambling to take notes. The students began developing the system more than one year ago and it currently is being used in five classes at Glenelg. According to the school, teachers who are using the product have seen a 10 point rise in the grades of students who have attention deficit problems.
