





# Definitions As Used In This Volume

ADOPTION, GUARDIANSHIP -- This includes all adoptions and guardianships including regular adoptions, guardianship with right to adoption and guardianship with right to consent to long-term case short of adoption. Guardianships of incompetents are reported in "Other - General Equity."

ADULT -- A person who is 18 years old or older charged with an offense relating to juveniles to be heard in Juvenile Court.

APPEAL -- The resorting to a higher court to reverse or correct a decision of a tribunal below. This includes appeals to the circuit court, the Court of Appeals, and the Court of Special Appeals.

Appeals to the circuit courts include:

- Record The judge's review of a written or electronic recording of the proceedings in the District Court.
- 2. De Novo The retrial of an entire case initially tried in the District Court.
- 3. Administrative Agency Appeals from decisions rendered by administrative agencies. For example:

County Commissioner
Department of Taxation and Assessments
Employment Security
Funeral Director
Liquor License Commissioners
Physical Therapy
State Comptroller (Sales Tax, etc.)
State Motor Vehicle Authority
Supervisors of Elections
Tax Court
Workmen's Compensation Commission
Zoning Appeals
Any other administrative body from which an appeal is authorized.

APPLICATION FOR LEAVE TO APPEAL -- Procedural method by which a petitioner seeks leave of the Court of Special Appeals to grant an appeal. When granted, the matter addressed is transferred to the direct appeal docket of the Court for customary briefing and argument. Maryland Rules of Procedure permit the filing of such applications in matters dealing with post conviction, inmate grievances and denial of or grant of excessive bail in habeas corpus proceedings.

<u>CASE</u> -- A matter having a unique docket number; includes original and reopened (post judgment) matters. (Note: In Fiscal 1982, reopened matters only include those cases which had a hearing.)

<u>CASELOAD</u> -- The total number of cases filed or pending with a court during a specific period of time. Cases may include all categories of matters (law, equity, juvenile, and criminal).

<u>C.I.N.A.</u> -- Child in Need of Assistance -- Refers to a child who needs the assistance of the court because:

- 1. The child is mentally handicapped or
- 2. Is not receiving ordinary and proper care and attention and
- 3. The parents, guardian or custodian are unable or unwilling to give proper care and attention.

C.I.N.S. -- Child in Need of Supervision -- Refers to a child who requires guidance, treatment or rehabilitation because of habitual truancy, ungovernableness or behavior that would endanger himself or others. Also included in this category is the commission of an offense applicable only to children.

CONDEMNATION -- The process by which property of a private owner is taken for public use without the owner's consent but upon the award and payment of just compensation.

CONTESTED CONFESSED JUDGMENT -- Contesting by a debtor of a judgment entered for a creditor immediately upon filing of a written statement by the creditor to the court.

CONTRACTS -- A case involving a dispute over an oral or written agreement between two or more parties.

Breaches of verbal or written contracts Landlord/tenant appeals from District Court Some attachments and removals Some claims for summary judgments

<u>DELINQUENCY</u> -- Commission of an act by a juvenile which would be a crime if committed by an adult.

<u>DISPOSITION</u> -- Entry of final judgment in a case.

DISTRICT COURT - CONTESTED -- Only applies to civil, a case that has gone to trial and both parties (plaintiff and defendant) appear.

DISTRICT COURT CRIMINAL CASE -- Single defendant charged per single incident. It may include multiple charges arising from the same incident.

<u>DISTRICT COURT FILING</u> -- The initiation of a civil action or case in the <u>District Court</u>. District Court criminal and motor vehicle cases are reported as "processed" rather than as "filed."

DIVORCE, NULLITY -- A proceeding to dissolve a marriage. Original filings under this category include divorce a vinculo matrimonii, divorce a mensa et thoro, and annulment. A reopened case under this category includes hearings held after final decree or other termination in the original case. A reopened case may involve review of matters other than the divorce itself as long as the original case was a divorce. (Examples of the latter may be a contempt proceeding for nonpayment of support, noncompliance with custody agreement, modification of support, custody, etc.)

DOCKET -- Formal record of court proceedings.

EQUITY HEARING -- See "Trials."

FILING -- Formal commencement of a judicial proceeding by submitting the necessary papers pertaining to it. Original filing under one docket number and subsequent reopenings (post judgment) under the same number are counted as separate filings. (Note: In Fiscal 1982, reopened filings include only those reopened cases which had a hearing.)

FISCAL YEAR -- The period of time from July 1 of one year through June 30 of the next. For example: July 1, 1981, to June 30, 1982.

#### **HEARINGS**

Criminal or Law -- Any activity occurring in the courtroom or in the judges' chambers on the record and/or in the presence of a clerk is considered a hearing (except motions to continue or trials). Electronic recording equipment, for definition purposes, is the equivalent to the presence of a court reporter.

Equity -- A presentation either before a judge or before a master empowered to make recommendations, on the record or in the presence of a clerk or court reporter, for purposes other than continuance or final determination of the facts of the case. Electronic recording equipment, for definition purposes, is the equivalent to the presence of a court reporter.

#### Examples of Hearings in Equity

Preliminary motions presented in court, except motions for continuance

Determination of alimony pendente lite, temporary custody, etc., in a divorce case

Contempt or modification hearings

Juvenile -- A presentation before a judge, master, or examiner on the record in the presence of a clerk or court reporter. Electronic recording equipment, for definition purposes, is the equivalent to the presence of a court reporter.

#### Examples of Hearings in Juvenile

Preliminary motions presented in court Arraignment or preliminary inquiry Detention (if after filing of petition) Merits or adjudication Disposition Restitution Waiver Review Violation of probation

INDICTMENT -- The product of a grand jury proceeding against an
individual.

INFORMATION -- Written accusation of a crime prepared by the State's Attorney's Office.

<u>JURY TRIAL PRAYER - MOTOR VEHICLE</u> -- A request for trial by jury in the circuit court for a charge normally heard in the District Court. A jury trial prayed for a motor vehicle case carries a sentence of more than six months.

JURY TRIAL PRAYER - OTHER (CRIMINAL) -- A request for a trial by jury in the circuit court for charges normally heard in the District Court, except traffic charges or nonsupport.

MISCELLANEOUS DOCKET -- Established for and maintained primarily as a method of recording and identifying those preliminary proceedings or collateral matters before the Court of Appeals other than direct appeals.

MOTOR TORTS -- Personal injury and property damage cases resulting from automobile accidents. (This does not include consent cases.)

MOTOR VEHICLE APPEALS -- An appeal of a District Court verdict in a traffic charge.

NOLLE PROSEQUI -- A formal entry upon the record by the plaintiff in a civil suit, or the State's Attorney in a criminal case, to no longer prosecute the case.

NONSUPPORT -- A criminal case involving the charge of nonsupport.

ORIGINAL FILING -- See "Filing."

OTHER APPEALS (CRIMINAL) -- An appeal of a District Court verdict except one arising from a traffic charge or nonsupport.

OTHER DOMESTIC RELATIONS -- Matters related to the family other than divorce, guardianship, adoption or paternity. Examples of this category include support, custody, and U.R.E.S.A. cases.

OTHER GENERAL EQUITY -- This category includes, among other things, injunctions, change of name, foreclosure, and guardianship of incompetent persons.

OTHER LAW -- This category includes:

Conversion
Detinue
Ejectment
Issues from Orphans' Court

Attachments on original process Mandamus Replevin

OTHER TORTS -- Personal injury and property damage cases resulting from:

Assault and battery - an unlawful force to inflict bodily injury upon another.

**Trespass** 

Certain attachments.

Consent tort.

False imprisonment - the plaintiff is confined within boundaries fixed by the defendant for some period of time.

Libel and slander - a defamation of character.

Malicious prosecution - without just cause an injury was done to somebody through the means of a legal court proceeding.

Negligence - any conduct falling below the standards established by law for the protection of others from unreasonable risk of harm.

Miscellaneous.

<u>PATERNITY</u> -- A suit to determine fatherhood responsibility of a child born out of wedlock. A reopened case under this category may involve matters other than the finding of paternity suit. Examples of the latter include reopening the paternity action after having been stetted,

contempt proceeding for nonpayment of child support and modification proceedings to change amount or terms of the decree.

PENDING CASE -- Case in which no final disposition has occurred.

<u>POST CONVICTION</u> -- Proceeding instituted to set aside a conviction or to correct a sentence that was unlawfully imposed.

REOPENED FILING -- The first hearing held on a case after a final judgment on the original matter has been entered.

<u>STET</u> -- Proceedings are stayed; one of the ways a case may be terminated.

TERMINATION -- Same as "Disposition."

#### TRIALS

#### CRIMINAL

<u>Court Trial</u> -- A contested hearing on the facts of the case to decide the guilt or innocence of the defendant where one or more witnesses has been sworn.

<u>Jury Trial</u> -- A contested hearing on the facts of the case to decide the guilt or innocence of the defendant, where the jury has been sworn.

#### EQUITY

Court Trial -- A hearing on the merits of the case either before a judge or before a master empowered to make recommendations, to present evidence for the final disposition, where testimony is given by one or more persons.

<u>Jury Trial</u> -- A contested hearing on the facts of the case to decide in favor of either party where a jury has been sworn.


#### LAW

<u>Court Trial</u> -- A contested hearing (excluding preliminary motion) on the facts of the case to decide in favor of either party where testimony is given by one or more persons.

<u>Jury Trial</u> -- A contested hearing on the facts of the case to decide in favor of either party where the jury has been sworn.

UNREPORTED CATEGORY -- A filing counted for case type (law, equity, criminal, or juvenile) but not for category within the case type.

#### THE COURT OF APPEALS

Statistics found in this section of the <u>Statistical Abstract</u> are generally tabulated by fiscal year although the Court of Appeals follows a year related to the term of court, which always begins on the second Monday in September. For each term of court there is a term docket which relates to appeals heard during that term. In the statistics that follow, some tables are tabulated by fiscal year and others are tabulated by term.

The September 1981 term dockets of the Court of Appeals recorded 864 filings. Included in that figure were 646 petitions for certiorari, 175 cases on the regular docket, 27 disciplinary proceedings involving members of the bar, 3 certified questions of law from the United States District Court, 4 character committee proceedings in regard to candidates for the bar, and 9 miscellaneous appeals. By the close of Fiscal 1982 the Court of Appeals had disposed of 863 matters, including 642 petitions for certiorari, 170 cases from its regular docket, 25 attorney grievance proceedings, 4 character committee proceedings, 3 certified questions of law, and 19 miscellaneous appeals.

The disposition of 170 regular appeals left only an additional 59 to be disposed of as of June 30, 1982. That latter number had nearly all been argued, but opinions had not been filed due to the constraints of time. Most of the 170 dispositions were from the 1981 docket (116), while one was from the 1979 docket and 3 were from the 1982 docket. Fifty regular appeals were from the 1980 docket, having been argued in Fiscal 1981, but were disposed of in Fiscal 1982. The Court filed a

total of 140 majority opinions in Fiscal 1982, 12 of which were per curiam. It also filed 28 dissenting opinions, 4 concurring opinions, and 7 dissenting in part and concurring in part. Appeals on the 1981 regular docket were argued, in an average, 3.4 months after filing and were decided in an additional 3.1 months.

Approximately 29.7 percent (52) of the 175 appeals on the 1981 regular docket originated in Baltimore City (Sixth Appellate Judicial Circuit). The Third Appellate Circuit recorded 39, followed by the Fourth with 37, the Fifth with 20, the Second with 18, and the First with 9. Following Baltimore City, Montgomery County had the next highest number of appeals with 31. Prince George's County was next with 29, Anne Arundel County with 17, and Baltimore County had only 14. The combined total of the four metropolitan counties plus Baltimore City was 143 or 81.7 percent of the total 1981 docket.

During Fiscal 1982, 642 petitions for certiorari were disposed of by the Court of Appeals. Criminal petitions constituted 51.9 percent (333) while the remaining 48.1 percent (309) were of a civil nature. The Court granted 18.8 percent (121) of the total petitions, 82 of which were civil and 39 of which were criminal.

During Fiscal 1982, the Court of Appeals admitted 919 persons to the practice of law, including 103 attorneys from other jurisdictions. It also conducted 25 disciplinary proceedings involving members of the Maryland Bar.



COURT OF APPEALS









#### THE COURT OF SPECIAL APPEALS

Abstract, the remarks as to term of court and fiscal year found in the previous section, are applicable here as well. During the fiscal year, July 1, 1981 through June 30, 1982, the Court of Special Appeals had 1,916 regular appeals before it for consideration. One hundred fifty-nine of those were from the 1980 term docket and had been heard during the previous fiscal year, but had not been disposed of by opinion due to the short amount of time between hearing and close of the fiscal year. Seventy-one cases were advanced from the 1982 term docket while 1,686 were filed on the 1981 term docket.

Although the Court had 1,916 regular appeals before it for consideration in Fiscal 1982, there actually were 1,839 appeals filed during the fiscal year from the 1981 and 1982 term dockets. These 1,839 appeals do not include 1,082 prehearing information reports which were received in the Clerk's Office pursuant to Maryland Rules 1022-1024. These appeals were either scheduled for prehearing conference or proceeded through the regular appellate process as stipulated in Maryland Rule 1024 a.1. Cases finally disposed of by prehearing conference are never placed on the regular docket or listed as filings. Cases not finally disposed of by this process will be placed on subsequent dockets and will then be included among filings.


Of the 1,742 appeals on the 1981 docket, 523 (30.0 percent) originated in the Sixth Appellate Judicial Circuit (Baltimore City), followed by the Third Appellate Circuit with 328, and the Fourth with

308. The Second, Fifth, and First Appellate Circuits tallied 210, 207, and 166, respectively. Prince George's County noted 241 appeals, followed closely by Montgomery County with 223. Baltimore and Anne Arundel Counties recorded nearly the same with 167 and 159. The total 790 appeals from these four counties, when added to the 523 from Baltimore City, accounted for over three-fourths (75.4 percent) of the 1981 docket.

By the close of the 1982 fiscal year, the Court of Special Appeals had disposed of 1,618 appeals, leaving 298 pending. The latter number had been argued, but had not been concluded by opinion. The Court filed 1,161 majority opinions of which 176 were reported and 985 were unreported. Appeals averaged 5.4 months from docketing to argument and 0.9 months from argument to disposition.

In addition to its massive regular docket, the Court also considered 134 applications for leave to appeal. It granted 6 of those applications.





THE CIRCUIT COURTS



#### THE CIRCUIT COURTS

#### FILINGS

Law, equity, juvenile, and criminal case filings amounted to 141,958 in Fiscal 1982. This figure also includes 3,269 juvenile causes heard at the District Court level in Montgomery County. With respect to total circuit court caseload, 42.1 percent of the filings were in equity, 21.5 percent in criminal, 21.0 percent in juvenile, and 15.4 percent in the law category.

The Fiscal 1982 filings of 141,958 decreased statistically by 3.3 percent over the 146,768 filings recorded last year. Increases were registered in all categories except criminal: Law filings, up 1.1 percent; equity filings, up 11.3 percent; and juvenile, up 17.3 percent. Criminal filings appeared to have dropped 33.6 percent.

One of the reasons for the statistical variance in criminal filings in Fiscal 1982 was that Baltimore City changed its procedures in July 1981 from counting individual charges to counting cases, so that cases now represent incidents rather than charges. However, even adjusting for this change in reporting procedures, there appears to have been a decrease in criminal filings, statewide. This was probably in large part produced by Chapter 608, Acts of 1981, effective July 1 of that year. The aim of this law was to reduce the number of jury trials prayed in District Court, and hence the number of such cases transferred to the circuit courts. A substantial reduction in such jury trial demands was recorded during Fiscal 1982. The increases in juvenile filings were in the delinquency and child in need of assistance

categories. However, these increases were mostly due to shifts from the unreported case categories in Fiscal 1981 to other specific case categories in Fiscal 1982.

In Fiscal 1982, 17,752 law cases filed in the five major jurisdictions of Baltimore County, Anne Arundel County, Montgomery County, Prince George's County, and Baltimore City accounted for 81.2 percent of the 21,852 State's total law caseload. This represents a small 2.8 percent increase from the 17,268 filings recorded for these jurisdictions in Fiscal 1981. The other 19 counties recorded 4,100 law cases; only 18.8 percent of the total law filings and representing a 5.5 percent decrease over the 4,340 cases counted last year. Declines were also noted in law filings in Baltimore County (5.3 percent), Anne Arundel County (4.7 percent), Montgomery County (2.3 percent), and Prince George's County (0.7 percent). Baltimore City was the only major jurisdiction which showed an increase in law filings, with a 14.0 percent higher rate.

Equity case filings in the four major jurisdictions and Baltimore City accounted for 42,894 cases or 71.8 percent of the State filings recorded at 59,781. The figures in the major jurisdictions rose by 12.5 percent over the 38,126 cases filed in Fiscal 1981. The other 19 counties consumed only 28.2 percent of the total caseload in Fiscal 1982, which amounted to 16,887 cases. This represents a growth of 8.2 percent over the 15,602 cases recorded last year. Growing rates of change were calculated for Prince George's County (36.8 percent), Anne Arundel County (15.0 percent), Baltimore County (7.6 percent), Montgomery County (4.8 percent), and Baltimore City (0.1 percent).

The Circuit Court for Montgomery County reported that, in exercising jurisdiction formerly held by an orphans' court, it conducted 88 hearings and signed 1,722 orders during Fiscal 1982. The Circuit Court for Harford County exercises the same jurisdiction and recorded 15 hearings and signed 584 orders.

Criminal case filings statewide totaled 30,575 in Fiscal 1982. The 23,553 criminal filings for the four major jurisdictions and Baltimore City represent a 36.6 percent decrease as compared to the 37,164 filings recorded last year. As mentioned previously, this was due to a new law and counting procedure. Metropolitan areas continue to consume the large majority of the State's criminal caseload (77.0 percent) compared to the amount of cases filed in the other 19 counties (23.0 percent). The other 19 counties recorded 7,022 criminal cases compared to 8,897 cases recorded last year, resulting in a 21.1 percent decline. Increases were noted in Montgomery (4.4 percent) and Prince George's Counties (6.5 percent). Decreases were recorded in Anne Arundel (2.4 percent) and Baltimore Counties (3.0 percent). A huge drop was noted in Baltimore City at 56.9 percent, but that is due in part to the new counting procedure, as discussed previously.

Applications for review of criminal sentences amounted to 235, of which 13 were withdrawn by the applicants. There were 183 applications in 1980-81 and 270 applications in 1979-80. This year the original sentence was decreased in 29 instances and unchanged in 178. One sentence was increased. Since the inception of the procedure to review criminal sentences in 1966, 4,371 applications have been filed.

There were 29,750 juvenile causes recorded statewide in Fiscal 1982. This includes the 3,269 causes filed in the District Court for Montgomery County. The four major jurisdictions and Baltimore City were responsible for 24,697 filings or 83.0 percent of the total juvenile caseload; a 19.4 percent increase over last year's figure of 20,679. The other 19 counties recorded 5,053 juvenile filings or 17.0 percent of the total State caseload; an increase of 7.7 percent over last year's figure of 4,692. Increases in the metropolitan areas of the State were as follows: Montgomery County (35.6 percent), Prince George's County (25.2 percent), Anne Arundel County (16.9 percent), Baltimore County (16.1 percent), and Baltimore City (12.4 percent).

#### **TERMINATIONS**

Terminations reported totaled 128,411 in Fiscal 1982 for the four major categories of law, equity, criminal, and juvenile. This figure includes 3,434 juvenile terminations heard at the District Court level in Montgomery County. There were 124,787 case terminations reported in Fiscal 1981. Terminations represented 90.5 percent of filings in Fiscal 1982.

This year the 14,300 law cases terminated in the five major jurisdictions of Baltimore County, Anne Arundel County, Montgomery County, Prince George's County, and Baltimore City accounted for 76.0 percent of the State's 18,810 law terminations. This represents a 3.7 percent increment over the 13,787 cases terminated for these jurisdictions in Fiscal 1981. The other 19 counties terminated 4,510 law cases; only 24.0 percent of the total law terminations. This shows a 19.1 percent

improvement over the 3,787 cases terminated last year. Statewide, the 18,810 law terminations rose by 7.0 percent over last year's figure of 17,574. In the metropolitan areas of Baltimore City and Baltimore County, terminations declined by 3.2 percent and 8.9 percent. Three jurisdictions, Anne Arundel County, Montgomery County, and Prince George's County, showed an increase in law terminations over the previous fiscal year of 27.1 percent, 5.9 percent, and 17.7 percent, respectively.

Case terminations in the equity category totaled 52,170 statewide, an increment of 16.7 percent over the 44,688 cases terminated last year. The four major jurisdictions and Baltimore City were responsible for 66.2 percent of the terminations or 34,558 cases. This shows a growth of 13.7 percent over the 30,399 terminated last year. The other 19 counties disposed of 17,612 cases or the remaining 33.8 percent of the equity cases terminated in the State. These terminations amounted to a 23.3 percent increase over the 14,289 equity cases terminated the previous year. Increases in the metropolitan areas of the State were as follows: Baltimore County (27.9 percent), Prince George's County (19.6 percent), Baltimore City (14.1 percent), and Anne Arundel County (3.7 percent). Montgomery County declined by 7.4 percent over last year.

The number of criminal terminations in the State amounted to 28,923 in Fiscal 1982; a 28.8 percent drop over the 40,624 dispositions recorded last year. Baltimore City and the four major jurisdictions disposed of 20,230 cases; 69.9 percent of the total but a decrease of 39.7 percent over the 33,537 terminated in Fiscal 1981. Nineteen other counties disposed of 8,693 criminal cases this year compared to 7,087

cases last year, resulting in an increase of 22.7 percent. The total share of the State's criminal terminations by the 19 other counties was 30.1 percent. Accelerations were registered in Prince George's County (23.4 percent), Baltimore County (20.4 percent), Anne Arundel County (17.1 percent), and Montgomery County (8.9 percent). Baltimore City decreased by 28.8 percent due to the new counting procedures and recently enacted legislation affecting jury trial prayers.

There were 28,508 juvenile causes terminated statewide in Fiscal 1982 which represents a growth rate of 30.2 percent when compared to the 21,901 terminations reported last year. This year's figure includes the 3,434 juvenile causes terminated at the District Court level in Montgomery County. Baltimore City and the four major jurisdictions account for 82.8 percent, or 23,596, of the total State dispositions. Last year 17.846 causes were terminated by these same jurisdictions, representing 81.5 percent of the total. The other 19 counties terminated 4,912 juvenile causes this year as compared to 4,055 last year; a difference of 21.1 percent. These counties were responsible for a small 17.2 percent of the State's juvenile terminations. Higher rates of change were recorded in all of the metropolitan jurisdictions: Montgomery County, a huge 124.6 percent; Prince George's County (41.9 percent); Baltimore County (35.5 percent); Anne Arundel County (14.5 percent); and Baltimore City (13.9 percent).

#### TRIALS

In Fiscal 1982 there were 18,810 dispositions of law cases statewide, of which 2,307 were dispositions by trial and accounted for

12.2 percent of the total. The majority of these trials were court trials, 1,382 or 59.1 percent, compared to the number of jury trials, 925 or 40.1 percent. The law jury trial to disposition ratio was lowest in Worcester County at 0.8 percent and highest in Dorchester County at 12.5 percent. Four metropolitan counties and Baltimore City were responsible for 685, or 74.1 percent, of all law jury trials. The other 19 counties held 240 law jury trials, making up only 25.9 percent of the total.

Court trials in law were held in 1,382 cases in Maryland. Anne Arundel County, Baltimore County, Montgomery County, Prince George's County, and Baltimore City heard 1,119, or 81.0 percent, of the total court law trials, while the other 19 counties heard 263, or 19.0 percent, of the cases. The law court trial to disposition ratio was highest in Garrett County at 15.6 percent and lowest in Caroline County at 1.3 percent.

The circuit courts reported 28,923 criminal terminations for the fiscal year. There were 8,207 cases (28.4 percent) disposed of by trial. Most trials (6,301 or 76.8 percent) were court trials compared to the number of jury trials (1,906 or 23.2 percent). The majority of jury trials (1,220) were held in the four largest counties and Baltimore City, contributing 64.0 percent to the total 1,906 jury trials held in the State. The other 19 counties contributed to 36.0 percent of the total and recorded 686 jury trials. The criminal jury trial to disposition ratio was lowest in Baltimore County at 1.1 percent and highest in Allegany County at 18.0 percent.

The four largest jurisdictions and Baltimore City were responsible for 3,669, or 58.2 percent, of the total 6,301 criminal court trials. Nineteen other counties held 2,632, or 41.8 percent, of the criminal court trials. The criminal court trial to disposition ratio was lowest in St. Mary's County at 1.5 percent and highest in Somerset County at 78.3 percent.

During the year, 6,729 requests for criminal jury trials were prayed at the District Court level to the circuit court. This represents a tremendous decrease over the 19,395 requests made in Fiscal 1981. This is the result of the new law (Ch. 608, Acts of 1981) that went into effect July 1, 1981, and new counting procedures in Baltimore City.



THE DISTRICT COURT



#### THE DISTRICT COURT

The District Court processed 636,427 motor vehicle cases, 135,447 criminal cases, and 509,254 civil cases in Fiscal 1982. The District Court for Montgomery County also reported an additional 3,269 juvenile filings.

Statewide, 176,404 motor vehicle cases went to trial, with the remaining 434,619 being disposed of without trial by payment or forfeiture. Baltimore County recorded the most motor vehicle trials, 47,293, followed by Baltimore City with 27,194 and Prince George's County with 18,720. Kent County registered the smallest number of motor vehicle trials, 396.

Over 34 percent of the District Court criminal caseload was processed in Baltimore City. The four largest counties accounted for 43 percent (58,685 cases) of the criminal workload, with Prince George's having the highest activity, followed by Baltimore, Montgomery, and Anne Arundel Counties. The smallest caseload in the criminal area was noted in Queen Anne's County, where 400 cases were terminated.

Filings in the civil area increased by 5.6 percent from 1980-81 to 1981-82. Baltimore City, as usual, accounted for the majority of civil filings, 185,921, followed by Prince George's and Baltimore Counties with 121,937 and 76,051, respectively. Somerset County recorded the smallest number of civil actions, 758.


