#### FALSE ALARM LAW WILL HELP FIGHT CRIME

Our police department is working hard to address crime in our communities, whether it is the recent arrests in the attack on a 14-year old in Crofton or shutting down a crack house in Brooklyn Park. My Administration has responded swiftly to both situations with help from the public.

But there are also things that can be done legislatively. I signed a bill into law last month that penalizes those who have repeated false burglar alarm calls to police. These are automated calls that can be fixed relatively easily. Meanwhile, false alarms waste thousands of hours of time for our officers to respond.

This new law will go a long way toward ensuring that our officers are devoting their time to crime fighting—not responding to false alarms.

## **COUNTY NEWS IN BRIEF**

## **▶** Maryland Committee Honors Employment of Guardsmen and Reservists

County Executive John R. Leopold received a citation from the Maryland Committee for Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve to honor his commitment to hiring National Guard and Reserve Members. During this Administration, 56 veterans have been hired as detention officers, surveyors, police officers and recreation workers. The County has also dedicated memorials to fallen veterans at Fort Smallwood Park and the Arundel Center.

### ▶ First Online Tax Sale Process Yields \$2.5 million in Unpaid Property Taxes

County Executive John R. Leopold declared the County's first online tax sale a success. The number of bidders increased by 55% over the 2008 sale and the successful bidders increased from 3 in 2008 to 32 in 2009. There were about 1,400 properties with taxes and fees due and 98% of the tax lien certificates were sold recovering approximately \$2.5 million for the County. The sale took place from June 4 until June 12.

## Sarah's House Makes a Difference by Getting a Families into Jobs and Housing

County Executive John R. Leopold continues to support Sarah's House in the budget because it aids children and families. Sarah's House is a partnership between Anne Arundel County, the U.S. Army and Catholic Charities, Inc. that provides 66 emergency shelter beds and 22 transitional beds for families seeking to move from homelessness to permanent housing. Eighty-five percent successfully move on to permanent housing.

## Administration Submits General Development Plan to County Council

County Executive John R. Leopold thanked the members of the Special Advisory Committee for their dedication to ensuring public participation during the drafting process for the General Development Plan. Legislation implementing the General Development Plan has been submitted to the County Council.
